- WHEREAS, Dashain Day is a festival, originating in Nepal, that is celebrated in
- 17 parts of South Asia and in South Asian communities around the world, including in
- 18 Maryland; and
- WHEREAS, The festival is rooted in the central cultural beliefs of unity and diversity
- and the belief that the world is one family, embodied by the spiritual Sanskrit phrase,
- 21 "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam"; and
- WHEREAS, The festival is celebrated from Ghatasthapana until Kojagrat Purnima,
- 23 lasting up to 15 days; and

- WHEREAS, During the festival, individuals make resolutions to create harmony in the fight against evil throughout the year; now, therefore,
- 3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 4 That Section(s) 7–415 through 7–417, respectively, of Article General Provisions of the
- 5 Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 7-416 through 7-418,
- 6 respectively.
- 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read 8 as follows:

- 11 THE GOVERNOR SHALL ANNUALLY PROCLAIM OCTOBER 5 AS DASHAIN DAY,
- 12 A FESTIVAL ORIGINATING IN NEPAL THAT CELEBRATES AND SYMBOLIZES VICTORY
- 13 OF GOOD OVER EVIL.
