AN ACT concerning 1

2 State Department of Education - Child Care Stabilization Grant Program and 3 Child Care Expansion Grant Program - Established Grants

FOR the purpose of establishing the Child Care Stabilization Grant Program and the Child 4 Care Expansion Grant Program in the State Department of Education; and generally 5 relating to the Child Care Stabilization Grant Program and the Child Care Expansion Crant Program requiring the State Department of Education to administer stabilization grants to child care providers in a certain fiscal year; providing for the priority of grant awards; and generally relating to child care stabilization grants.
