1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Anne Arundel County – Alcoholic Beverages – Board of License Commissioners**
3 **Term Limits and Commercial Bingo License ~~– Term Limits~~**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a member of the Board of License Commissioners for Anne
5 Arundel County from serving more than four consecutive terms; extending the term
6 of a certain member of the Board; authorizing the Board to issue a commercial bingo
7 license to the owner of a licensed commercial bingo establishment; and generally
8 relating to ~~the Board of License Commissioners for~~ alcoholic beverages in Anne
9 Arundel County.

9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND.
 10 That Section(s) 11–1002.1 of Article – Alcoholic Beverages of the Annotated Code of
 11 Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 11–1002.2.

12 ~~SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND~~
 13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland read
 14 as follows:

15 **Article – Alcoholic Beverages**

17 This title applies only in Anne Arundel County.

18 11–201.

19 There is a Board of License Commissioners for Anne Arundel County.

21 (c) (1) The term of a member is 2 years.

22 (2) **A MEMBER MAY NOT SERVE MORE THAN FOUR CONSECUTIVE**
 23 **TERMS.**

24 **11–1002.1.**

25 **(A) IN THIS SECTION, “COMMERCIAL BINGO”:**

26 **(1) MEANS ANY BINGO GAME AUTHORIZED BY LAW IN THE COUNTY**
 27 **FOR WHICH ANY TYPE OF CONSIDERATION IS PAID OR COLLECTED IN ORDER TO**
 28 **PLAY THE GAME; AND**

29 **(2) DOES NOT INCLUDE BINGO CONDUCTED BY CHARITABLE OR**
 30 **NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS IN ACCORDANCE WITH TITLE 13, SUBTITLE 4 OF THE**
 31 **CRIMINAL LAW ARTICLE.**

1 **(B) THERE IS A COMMERCIAL BINGO LICENSE.**

2 **(C) THE BOARD MAY ISSUE THE LICENSE TO THE OWNER OF A LICENSED**
 3 **COMMERCIAL BINGO ESTABLISHMENT.**

4 **(D) THE LICENSE AUTHORIZES THE LICENSE HOLDER TO SELL BEER, WINE,**
 5 **AND LIQUOR FROM ANY LOCATION IN THE COMMERCIAL BINGO ESTABLISHMENT**
 6 **FOR ON-PREMISES CONSUMPTION ANYWHERE IN THE ESTABLISHMENT.**

7 **(E) BEER, WINE, AND LIQUOR PURCHASED UNDER THE LICENSE MAY BE**
 8 **CARRIED AND CONSUMED ANYWHERE IN THE COMMERCIAL BINGO ESTABLISHMENT.**

9 **(F) (1) THE LICENSE HOLDER MAY SELL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES**
 10 **MONDAY THROUGH SUNDAY DURING NORMAL BUSINESS HOURS, BUT NOT LATER**
 11 **THAN 2 A.M.**

12 **(2) THE LICENSE HOLDER NEED NOT OBTAIN A SUNDAY LICENSE**
 13 **UNDER § 11-2004 OF THIS TITLE TO SELL ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ON SUNDAY.**

14 **(G) THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE IS \$2,500.**

15 SECTION ~~2~~ 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That notwithstanding §
 16 11-202(c)(1) of the Alcoholic Beverages Article, as enacted by Section ~~1~~ 2 of this Act, the
 17 term of the member of the Board of License Commissioners for Anne Arundel County who
 18 was initially appointed by the Governor to the Board in 2021 shall expire on April 30, 2024.

19 SECTION ~~3~~ 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act ~~shall take effect~~
 20 ~~July 1, 2022~~ is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the
 21 public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of
 22 all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take
 23 effect from the date it is enacted.
