FOR the purpose of prohibiting a member of the Board of License Commissioners for Anne Arundel County from serving more than four consecutive terms; extending the term of a certain member of the Board; <u>authorizing the Board to issue a commercial bingo license to the owner of a licensed commercial bingo establishment</u> ; and generally relating to the Board of License Commissioners for <u>alcoholic beverages in Anne Arundel County</u> .

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2022 is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three–fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
