- 4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a public school from prohibiting a student from organizing 5 or participating in a student-organized peaceful demonstration, imposing certain 6 limits on a student's right to free speech while participating in a student-organized 7 peaceful demonstration, or disciplining a student for organizing or participating in a 8 student-organized peaceful demonstration under certain circumstances; requiring 9 each county board of education to develop a written policy regarding student-organized peaceful demonstrations; and generally relating 10 11 student-organized peaceful demonstrations and student discipline.
