- 1 **[(a)] (B)** This section applies to a law enforcement officer of a jurisdiction in the 2 State who engages in fresh pursuit of a person in the State.
- 3 **[(b)] (C)** (1) Fresh pursuit is pursuit that is continuous and without 4 unreasonable delay.
- 5 (2) Fresh pursuit need not be instant pursuit.
- 6 (3) In determining whether the pursuit meets the elements of fresh pursuit, a court shall apply the requirements of the common law definition of fresh pursuit 8 that relates to these elements.
- 9 [(c)] (D) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION, A
 10 law enforcement officer may engage in fresh pursuit of a person who:
- 11 (1) has committed or is reasonably believed by the law enforcement officer 12 to have committed a felony in the jurisdiction in which the law enforcement officer has the 13 power of arrest; or
