A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Maryland Electricians Act – Revisions**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that the State Board of Electricians credit an applicant's work
4 as part of certain apprenticeships for the experience required for certain electrician
5 licenses; requiring the State Board to waive the examination requirements for
6 certain applicants for a journeyman electrician license; adjusting the number of
7 years an applicant for journeyman electrician must work under a certain
8 circumstance; authorizing a master electrician or a person to whom a master
9 electrician assigns a local registration to not maintain certain insurance under
10 certain circumstances; requiring the Maryland Department of Labor to examine
11 certain memoranda of understanding; requiring the Department to attempt to
12 renegotiate certain memoranda of understanding in certain circumstances; requiring
13 the Department to report to the Governor and the General Assembly on certain
14 memoranda of understanding; and generally relating to the licensure of electricians
15 in the State.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
22 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

23 **Article – Business Occupations and Professions**

24 6–304.

25 (a) To qualify for a State license, an applicant shall meet the requirements of this
26 section.

EXPLANATION: CAPITALS INDICATE MATTER ADDED TO EXISTING LAW.

1 (b) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, an applicant for a master
2 electrician license shall have been engaged or employed regularly and principally in
3 providing electrical services for all types of electrical equipment and apparatuses for at
4 least 7 years while under the direction and supervision of:

5 (i) a master electrician; or

6 (ii) a similarly qualified employee of a governmental unit.

7 (2) (I) The State Board may allow an applicant up to 3 years of credit
8 toward the experience required under paragraph (1) of this subsection, if the State Board
9 determines that the applicant has completed a formal course of study or professional
10 training in electrical installation comparable to the required experience.

11 (II) **THE STATE BOARD SHALL CREDIT TOWARD THE**
12 **EXPERIENCE REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION AN**
13 **APPLICANT'S WORK AS PART OF A SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED ELECTRICIAN**
14 **APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM APPROVED BY THE MARYLAND APPRENTICESHIP AND**
15 **TRAINING COUNCIL OR THE FEDERAL OFFICE OF APPRENTICESHIP.**

16 (c) (1) **[An] SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, AN**
17 applicant for a journeyman electrician license shall have been engaged or employed
18 regularly and principally in providing electrical services for all types of electrical equipment
19 and apparatuses for at least 4 years while under the direction and supervision of:

20 **[(1)] (I)** a master electrician; or

21 **[(2)] (II)** an employee of a governmental unit who is similarly qualified as
22 a master electrician licensed under this title.

23 (2) **THE STATE BOARD SHALL CREDIT TOWARD THE EXPERIENCE**
24 **REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION AN APPLICANT'S WORK AS**
25 **PART OF A SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED ELECTRICIAN APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM**
26 **APPROVED BY THE MARYLAND APPRENTICESHIP AND TRAINING COUNCIL OR THE**
27 **FEDERAL OFFICE OF APPRENTICESHIP.**

28 (d) Except as otherwise provided in this subtitle, the applicant shall pass an
29 examination given by the State Board under this subtitle.

30 (e) The State Board may investigate the qualifications of each applicant to
31 determine whether the applicant meets the requirements of this section.

1 The State Board shall waive the experience AND EXAMINATION requirements for
2 an applicant for a journeyman electrician license if the applicant:

3 (1) (i) provides written proof of ~~[3]~~ 4 years of work experience providing
4 electrical services under the control and direction of a master electrician; and

5 (ii) submits an application for a license to the State Board on or
6 before December 31, 2022; or

7 (2) provides written proof that the applicant has successfully completed an
8 electrician apprenticeship program approved by the Maryland Apprenticeship and
9 Training Council or the federal Office of Apprenticeship that consists of:

10 (i) at least 576 classroom hours; and

11 (ii) 8,000 hours of work experience.

12 6-604.

13 (a) This section does not apply to a State licensee on inactive status.

14 (b) **(1) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS**
15 **SUBSECTION, A master electrician who is licensed by the State Board and provides**
16 **electrical services or a person to whom a master electrician licensed by the State Board**
17 **assigns a local registration under this title shall:**

18 **[(1)] (I) maintain general liability insurance in the amount of at least**
19 **\$300,000;**

20 **[(2)] (II) maintain property damage insurance in the amount of at least**
21 **\$100,000; and**

22 **[(3)] (III) submit proof of the required insurance to the State Board.**

23 **(2) A MASTER ELECTRICIAN OR A PERSON TO WHOM A MASTER**
24 **ELECTRICIAN ASSIGNS A LOCAL REGISTRATION UNDER THIS TITLE IS NOT**
25 **REQUIRED TO MAINTAIN GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE AND PROPERTY DAMAGE**
26 **INSURANCE IF THE MASTER ELECTRICIAN OR A PERSON TO WHOM A LOCAL**
27 **REGISTRATION IS ASSIGNED:**

28 **(I) ONLY PROVIDES ELECTRICAL SERVICES WITHIN THE SCOPE**
29 **OF THE LICENSE OR REGISTRATION WHEN EMPLOYED BY ANOTHER PERSON WHO**
30 **MAINTAINS GENERAL LIABILITY AND PROPERTY DAMAGE INSURANCE WITH AT**
31 **LEAST AS MUCH COVERAGE AS THAT LISTED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS**
32 **SUBSECTION; AND**

1 **(II) SUBMITS EVIDENCE OF THE EMPLOYER’S INSURANCE TO**
2 **THE STATE BOARD.**

3 (c) (1) An applicant for a State license shall submit proof of the insurance
4 required under this section to the State Board with the license application.

5 (2) The State Board may not issue a State license to an applicant to whom
6 the insurance requirements of this section would apply unless the applicant submits proof
7 of the insurance.

8 (d) Unless an applicant meets the insurance requirements of this section, the
9 State Board may not renew a State license of the applicant to whom the insurance
10 requirements of this section would apply.

11 (e) If the insurance required under this section is canceled, the insurer shall
12 notify the State Board within 10 days after the date of cancellation.

13 (f) If a local jurisdiction requires an applicant for a local license to execute a bond
14 to the local jurisdiction, the applicant may satisfy the bond requirement by submitting proof
15 of the insurance required under this section.

16 **SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:**

17 (a) The Maryland Department of Labor shall review each memorandum of
18 understanding that the State has entered into with another state or territory guaranteeing
19 a reciprocal recognition of electrician licenses to determine whether all licenses issued to
20 master electricians under Title 6 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article is
21 covered by the terms of the memorandum of understanding.

22 (b) If the Maryland Department of Labor determines that the terms of a
23 memorandum of understanding do not cover a master electrician who is licensed in
24 accordance with Title 6 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article, the
25 Department shall seek to renegotiate the terms of the memorandum of understanding to
26 include licenses for those master electricians who are not covered.

27 (c) On or before January 1, 2023, the Maryland Department of Labor shall report
28 to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, the
29 General Assembly on:

30 (1) any outstanding memoranda of understanding with other states or
31 territories guaranteeing a reciprocal recognition of electrician licenses that:

32 (i) do not recognize master electricians authorized for licensure
33 under Title 6 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article; and

34 (ii) that the Department was unable to renegotiate; and

1 (2) actions needed in order to guarantee that a license issued to a master
2 electrician in accordance with Title 6 of the Business Occupations and Professions Article
3 can be brought under the terms of a memorandum of understanding identified in item (1)
4 of this subsection, including:

- 5 (i) any necessary legislation; and
- 6 (ii) any necessary appropriation of funds.

7 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
8 1, 2022.
