SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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Article – Tax – General

16 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS 17 INDICATED.

18 (2) "CAREGIVER" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO PROVIDES CARE OR 19 SUPPORT TO A QUALIFIED FAMILY MEMBER.

20(3) "LICENSED PHYSICIAN" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 14–10121OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE.

1 (4) "PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 15–101 2 OF THE HEALTH OCCUPATIONS ARTICLE.


3 (5) (I) "QUALIFIED EXPENSES" MEANS EXPENSES PAID OR 4 INCURRED BY A CAREGIVER FOR GOODS OR SERVICES THAT RELATE DIRECTLY TO 5 THE CARE OR SUPPORT OF A QUALIFIED FAMILY MEMBER, INCLUDING:

6 **1.** THE IMPROVEMENT OR ALTERATION OF THE 7 CAREGIVER'S PRIMARY RESIDENCE TO ENABLE OR ASSIST THE QUALIFIED FAMILY 8 MEMBER TO BE MOBILE, SAFE, OR INDEPENDENT;

$13 \\ 14 \\ 15 \\ 16 \\ 17$	(B) SUBJECT TO THE LIMITATIONS OF THIS SECTION, A CAREGIVER MAY CLAIM A CREDIT AGAINST THE STATE INCOME TAX IN THE AMOUNT DETERMINED UNDER SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION FOR QUALIFIED EXPENSES PAID OR INCURRED DURING THE TAXABLE YEAR IF THE CAREGIVER'S FEDERAL ADJUSTED GROSS INCOME DOES NOT EXCEED:

3 (D) THE COMPTROLLER MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THE 4 PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 6 1, 2022, and shall be applicable to all taxable years beginning after December 31, 2021.
