## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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- FOR the purpose of altering certain definitions of "health care provider" to include pharmacists for the purposes of provisions of law related to health care malpractice claims, destruction of medical records, and HIV testing; requiring certain insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and health maintenance organizations to provide reimbursement for certain health care services provided by a pharmacist at the same rate as the same services provided by a physician, physician's assistant, or nurse practitioner; and generally relating to pharmacists.

- 19 (b) An entity subject to this section shall provide coverage for services rendered 20 by a licensed pharmacist [under § 12-509 of the Health Occupations Article] to an 21individual who is covered under a policy or contract issued or delivered by the entity, to the 22same extent as COVERAGE IS PROVIDED UNDER THE POLICY OR CONTRACT FOR THE 23 SAME services rendered by [any other licensed health care practitioner, for patient 24assessment regarding and in administering self-administered medications or maintenance 25 injectable medications] A PHYSICIAN, PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT, OR CERTIFIED NURSE PRACTITIONER, IF THE SERVICES ARE: 26
- 27 (1) WITHIN THE SCOPE OF PRACTICE OF THE PHARMACIST; AND
- 28 (2) RENDERED BY THE PHARMACIST IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE LAWS 29 AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE PHARMACIST'S LICENSE.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 31 October 1, 2022.
