CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Education and Labor and Employment – Cyber Warrior Diversity Program and**
3 **Workforce Development – Development for Cybersecurity**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Maryland Higher Education Commission, in consultation
5 with a certain organization, to identify certification trends in information technology
6 and cybersecurity sectors on or before a certain date each year and expand the Cyber
7 Warrior Diversity Program under certain circumstances; repealing the requirement
8 that the Commission allocate certain funds to certain institutions in the Program on
9 a certain basis; establishing requirements related to unexpended funds allocated by
10 the Commission under the Program; establishing the Cybersecurity Workforce
11 Accelerator Program at the University of Maryland Baltimore County to increase the
12 cybersecurity workforce in the State, increase the investment of the State in
13 cybersecurity workforce programs and educational programs at certain institutions,
14 and for other purposes related to the cybersecurity workforce in the State; requiring
15 the Department of Commerce and the Maryland Department of Labor to assist in
16 administering the Accelerator Program as necessary; establishing the Cybersecurity
17 Workforce Accelerator Fund; and generally relating to the Cyber Warrior Diversity
18 Program, the Cybersecurity Workforce Accelerator, and cybersecurity workforce
19 programs.

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
12 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 (a) In this subtitle the following words have the meanings indicated.

16 (c) “Governing entity” means:

17 (1) The Board of Trustees of Baltimore City Community College;

18 (2) The President of Bowie State University;

19 (3) The President of Coppin State University;

21 (5) The President of the University of Maryland Eastern Shore; and

22 (6) The President of the University of Maryland Baltimore County
23 Training Centers.

24 (d) “Program” means a Cyber Warrior Diversity Program.

26 (a) There is a Cyber Warrior Diversity Program at:

27 (1) Baltimore City Community College;

28 (2) Bowie State University;

1 (v) The University of Maryland Eastern Shore; and

2 (2) \$500 per student at the University of Maryland Baltimore County
3 Training Centers, for the purpose of participation in job apprenticeship events.

4 (c) On or before December 15, 2019, and each December 15 thereafter, the
5 governing entities shall notify the Commission of the number of students enrolled in each
6 institution's Program for the current academic year.

7 (d) [(1)] The funding provided in each fiscal year in accordance with this section
8 shall supplement, but not supplant, any funds that would otherwise be provided for each
9 institution.

10 [(2) The Commission annually shall allocate funds to Baltimore City
11 Community College, Bowie State University, Coppin State University, Morgan State
12 University, the University of Maryland Eastern Shore, and the University of Maryland
13 Baltimore County Training Centers on a pro rata basis according to the most recent
14 enrollment data required under subsection (c) of this section.]

5 **(2)** THERE IS A CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE ACCELERATOR FUND.

6 **(3)** THE PURPOSE OF THE FUND IS TO SUPPORT INNOVATIVE
7 APPROACHES TO MEETING CYBERSECURITY WORKFORCE NEEDS.

8 **(4)** THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM SHALL ADMINISTER THE FUND.

9 **(5) (I)** THE FUND IS A SPECIAL, NONLAPSING FUND THAT IS NOT
10 SUBJECT TO § 7-302 OF THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE.

11 **(II)** THE STATE TREASURER SHALL HOLD THE FUND
12 SEPARATELY, AND THE COMPTROLLER SHALL ACCOUNT FOR THE FUND.

13 **(6)** THE FUND CONSISTS OF:

14 **(I)** MONEY APPROPRIATED IN THE STATE BUDGET TO THE
15 FUND; AND

16 **(II)** ANY OTHER MONEY FROM ANY OTHER SOURCE ACCEPTED
17 FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE FUND.

18 **(7)** THE FUND MAY BE USED ONLY FOR:

19 **(I)** ADMINISTRATION OF THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM; AND

20 **(II)** PROVIDING GRANTS TO ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY
21 SCHOOLS, INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION, INCLUDING COMMUNITY
22 COLLEGES, AND NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS TO OPERATE CYBERSECURITY
23 WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS BASED ON THE STRATEGIC PLAN OF THE

28 CREDITED TO THE GENERAL FUND OF THE STATE.

1 SUPPLEMENTAL TO AND ARE NOT INTENDED TO TAKE THE PLACE OF FUNDING THAT
2 OTHERWISE WOULD BE APPROPRIATED FOR THOSE PURPOSES.

3 (I) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1 ~~EACH YEAR, 2023~~, THE UNIVERSITY OF
4 MARYLAND BALTIMORE COUNTY, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE DEPARTMENT AND
5 THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE, SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT ON THE OPERATION
6 AND PERFORMANCE OF THE ACCELERATOR PROGRAM TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN
7 ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1257 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL
8 ASSEMBLY.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the General
10 Assembly that:

11 (1) in administering the Cybersecurity Workforce Accelerator Program
12 established under § 11-606 of the Labor and Employment Article, as enacted by Section 1
13 of this Act, the University of Maryland Baltimore County shall:

14 (i) work with the Cybersecurity Association of Maryland, Inc.'s
15 workforce development committee; and

16 (ii) use the Talent Pipeline Management approach codified by the
17 U.S. Chamber of Commerce Foundation; and

18 (2) any money invested in training programs in the Accelerator Program
19 may be used to serve as matching funds for the purpose of applying for any available federal
20 Build Back Better funds of the U.S. Economic Development Administration.

21 SECTION ~~2~~ 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
22 July 1, 2022. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June 30,
23 2024, this Act, with no further action required by the General Assembly, shall be abrogated
24 and of no further force and effect.
