Article – Criminal Procedure

17 (a) (1) Except as provided in [subsection] SUBSECTIONS (b) AND (C) of this 18 section, a person may not record or broadcast any criminal matter, including a trial, 19 hearing, motion, or argument, that is held in trial court or before a grand jury.

20 (2) This prohibition applies to the use of television, radio, and photographic 21 or recording equipment.

22 (b) Subsection (a) of this section does not apply to the use of electronic or 23 photographic equipment approved by the court:
