SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 17 **THIS SUBTITLE APPLIES ONLY:**

18(1) IN A COUNTY IN WHICH THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY19AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES HAS ESTABLISHED A PROBATION WORK READINESS20PILOT PROGRAM UNDER § 3–2302 OF THIS SUBTITLE; AND

21 (2) TO THE EXTENT THAT FUNDS ARE PROVIDED IN AN ANNUAL 22 STATE BUDGET FOR A PROBATION WORK READINESS PILOT PROGRAM.

2 (A) THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES 3 SHALL ESTABLISH A PROBATION WORK READINESS PILOT PROGRAM IN AT LEAST 4 TWO COUNTIES IN THE STATE.

5 (B) THE PURPOSE OF THE PROGRAM IS TO PROVIDE DEDICATED SERVICES 6 FOR INDIVIDUALS PLACED ON PROBATION TO OBTAIN AND RETAIN EMPLOYMENT.

7 (C) THE PROGRAM SHALL:

8 (1) PROVIDE DEDICATED SERVICES FOR INDIVIDUALS PLACED ON 9 PROBATION TO OBTAIN AND RETAIN EMPLOYMENT;

10 (2) SPECIALIZE IN THE EMPLOYMENT NEEDS OF INDIVIDUALS ON 11 PROBATION;

12 (3) ACTIVELY RECRUIT EMPLOYERS WHO ARE RECEPTIVE TO 13 EMPLOYING INDIVIDUALS ON PROBATION;

14(4)PROVIDE JOB TRAINING TO PARTICIPANTS BASED ON IDENTIFIED15NEEDS; AND

16 **(5)** IMPLEMENT A DATA MANAGEMENT SYSTEM TO PROVIDE 17 DETAILED INFORMATION ON THE OUTCOMES OF PARTICIPANTS IN THE PROGRAM.

18 (D) THE DIVISION OF PAROLE AND PROBATION WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT 19 OF PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONAL SERVICES SHALL DEVELOP GUIDELINES 20 FOR THE PROGRAM, INCLUDING:

21 (1) CRITERIA FOR THE SELECTION OF PROVIDERS OF EMPLOYMENT 22 SERVICES UNDER THE PROGRAM;

23 (2) CRITERIA FOR THE SELECTION OF PARTICIPANTS IN THE 24 PROGRAM;

25 (3) LIMITS ON THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF PARTICIPANTS IN THE 26 PROGRAM;

(4) STIPENDS PAID TO PARTICIPANTS IN THE PROGRAM, WHICH
 SHALL BE AT A MINIMUM EQUAL TO THE LIVING WAGE, AS DEFINED IN § 18–103 OF
 THE STATE FINANCE AND PROCUREMENT ARTICLE; AND

(5) **PERFORMANCE GOALS FOR THE PROGRAM.**

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SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before October 1, 2023, and October 1, 2024, the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services shall submit a report to the General Assembly, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State Government Article, that evaluates the Probation Work Readiness Pilot Program established by this Act.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July
1, 2022. Section 1 of this Act shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of
June 30, 2024, Section 1 of this Act, with no further action required by the General
Assembly, shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
