A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning 2 **Hospital Flu Vaccines** 3 FOR the purpose of requiring hospitals to immunize patients against the influenza virus 4 and pneumococcal disease except under certain circumstances; providing for the 5 manner of obtaining consent for and conducting the immunizations for a hospital patient; and generally relating to offering immunizations to hospital patients. 6 7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, 8 Article – Health – General 9 Section 18-404 10 Annotated Code of Maryland 11 (2019 Replacement Volume and 2021 Supplement) 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 13 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Health - General 14 15 18-404. 16 (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated. (a) "Employee" means an individual employed full-time or part-time 17 18 directly, through contract with another entity, or as an independent contractor, by a related 19 institution. "HOSPITAL" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 19-301 OF THIS 20 **(3)** 21ARTICLE.



- 1 **[**(3)**] (4)** "Medically contraindicated" means that a medical treatment is 2 potentially detrimental to the health of the individual intended to be treated.
- 3 [(4)] (5) "Related institution" has the meaning provided under § 19–301 4 of this article.
- 5 (b) (1) Subject to subsection (e) of this section, each related institution in the 6 State shall immunize residents against the influenza virus and pneumococcal disease.
- 7 (2) Subject to subsection (e) of this section, each related institution in the 8 State shall immunize employees against the influenza virus.
- 9 (3) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (E) OF THIS SECTION, EACH HOSPITAL 10 IN THE STATE SHALL IMMUNIZE PATIENTS AGAINST INFLUENZA VIRUS AND 11 PNEUMOCOCCAL DISEASE.
- 12 **[**(3)**] (4)** Before an immunization under this section is administered, the 13 **HOSPITAL OR** related institution shall obtain written consent to administer the 14 immunization from:
- 15 (i) The resident [or], employee, OR PATIENT receiving the 16 immunization; or
- 17 (ii) The **PARENT OR** legal guardian of the resident **OR PATIENT** 18 receiving the immunization.
- 19 (c) Each **HOSPITAL OR** related institution shall conduct the immunizations 20 required under subsection (b) of this section:
- 21 (1) In accordance with the recommendations established by the Advisory 22 Committee on Immunization Process of the United States Centers for Disease Control and
- 23 Prevention that are in effect at the time the HOSPITAL OR related institution conducts the
- 24 immunizations; and
- 25 (2) [By] **FOR A RELATED INSTITUTION, BY** December 1 of each year that 26 the immunization is required.
- 27 (d) A HOSPITAL THAT ACCEPTS AN INDIVIDUAL AS A NEW PATIENT OR related institution that accepts an individual as a new resident or accepts an individual as 29 a new employee after December 1 but before April 1 shall:
- 30 (1) Determine the individual's status for immunization as required under 31 subsection (b) of this section; and
- 32 (2) If necessary, provide or arrange for an immunization as required under 33 subsection (b) of this section.

- 1 (e) A resident [or], employee, **OR PATIENT** is not required to receive a vaccine 2 under this section if:
- 3 (1) The vaccine is medically contraindicated for the resident [or], 4 employee, OR PATIENT;
- 5 (2) The vaccine is against the resident's [or], employee's, OR PATIENT'S religious beliefs; or
- 7 (3) After being fully informed by the **HOSPITAL OR** related institution of the health risks associated with not receiving a vaccine, the resident [or], employee, **OR** 9 **PATIENT** refuses the vaccine.
- 10 (f) (1) (i) Each related institution shall document the annual 11 immunization against influenza virus and immunization against pneumococcal disease 12 received by each resident in the resident's medical record.
- 13 (ii) Each related institution shall document the annual 14 immunization against influenza virus received by each employee in the employee's 15 personnel file.
- 16 (III) EACH HOSPITAL SHALL DOCUMENT THE ANNUAL 17 IMMUNIZATION AGAINST INFLUENZA VIRUS AND IMMUNIZATION AGAINST 18 PNEUMOCOCCAL DISEASE RECEIVED BY EACH PATIENT IN THE PATIENT'S MEDICAL 19 RECORD.
- 20 (2) If a resident [or], employee, **OR PATIENT** refuses to be immunized as required under subsection (b) of this section, the **HOSPITAL OR** related institution shall document the refusal and the reason for the refusal.
- 23 (g) Each **HOSPITAL AND** related institution shall:
- 24 (1) Notify each prospective resident [and], each prospective employee, AND
 25 EACH PROSPECTIVE PATIENT of the immunization requirements of this section and
 26 request that the resident [or], employee, OR PATIENT agree to be immunized in accordance
 27 with subsection (b)(3) of this section; and
- 28 (2) Make available to all residents [and], employees, AND PATIENTS of the 29 HOSPITAL OR related institution educational and informational materials relating to 30 immunization against influenza virus and immunization against pneumococcal disease.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2022.
