## 1 AN ACT concerning

## Developmental Disabilities Administration – Self–Directed Services (Self–Direction Act of 2022)

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Developmental Disabilities Administration to establish and provide training materials to coordinators of community services on 5 6 self-directed services; requiring coordinators of community services to educate a 7 certain recipient on self-directed services all models of services available to the recipient at certain times; providing for the services and manner of delivering 8 9 services that the Administration provides to a recipient who receives self-directed 10 services; requiring that home- and community-based services waiver recipients 11 receive support broker services; requiring the Administration to submit a certain 12 waiver application for a certain purpose by a certain date; requiring the 13 Administration to leverage certain federal funding for a certain purpose; and generally relating to Developmental Disabilities Administration services. 14
