A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

Dams With Hydroelectric Power Plants - Annual Compensation Fee

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the owner of a dam associated with a certain hydroelectric 4 power plant to pay an annual compensation fee to the Department of the 5 Environment for the use of State land and waterways beginning on a certain date; 6 requiring the Public Service Commission to determine the average price of a Tier 2 7 renewable energy credit for certain renewable energy portfolio standard compliance 8 years; prohibiting the owner of the dam from applying to or petitioning the 9 Commission to increase the hydroelectric power plant's rates as a means of offsetting the cost of the compensation fee; requiring the Department to transfer revenue 10 11 generated from the compensation fee to the Chesapeake Bay Trust for certain 12 purposes; and generally relating to an annual compensation fee for dams associated with hydroelectric power plants. 13

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
- 20 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 23 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 24 INDICATED.

- 1 (2) "RENEWABLE ENERGY CREDIT" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 2 7–701 OF THIS TITLE.
- 3 (3) "RENEWABLE ENERGY PORTFOLIO STANDARD" HAS THE 4 MEANING STATED IN § 7–701 OF THIS TITLE.
- 5 (4) "Tier 2" means a Tier 2 renewable source as defined in § 6 7–701 of this title.
- 7 (B) BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2023, THE OWNER OF A DAM ASSOCIATED WITH
- 8 A HYDROELECTRIC POWER PLANT THAT HAS A GENERATING CAPACITY OF AT LEAST
- 9 30 MEGAWATTS AND IS CONNECTED WITH THE ELECTRIC DISTRIBUTION GRID
- 10 SERVING MARYLAND SHALL PAY AN ANNUAL COMPENSATION FEE TO THE
- 11 DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT FOR THE USE OF STATE LAND AND
- 12 WATERWAYS.
- 13 (C) (1) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (3) OF THIS SUBSECTION, 14 THE COMPENSATION FEE SHALL BE:
- 15 (I) CALCULATED ON AN ANNUAL BASIS; AND
- 16 (II) COMPUTED BY MULTIPLYING:
- 17 1. The megawatt-hours of electricity
- 18 GENERATED BY THE HYDROELECTRIC POWER PLANT DURING THE PREVIOUS YEAR;
- 19 2. The average price of a Tier 2 renewable
- 20 ENERGY CREDIT FOR THE PREVIOUS RENEWABLE ENERGY PORTFOLIO STANDARD
- 21 COMPLIANCE YEAR, AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION; AND
- **3. 80**%.
- 23 (2) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 31, 2023, AND ON OR BEFORE EACH
- 24 JANUARY 31 THEREAFTER, THE COMMISSION SHALL DETERMINE THE AVERAGE
- 25 PRICE OF A TIER 2 RENEWABLE ENERGY CREDIT FOR THE PREVIOUS RENEWABLE
- 26 ENERGY PORTFOLIO STANDARD COMPLIANCE YEAR.
- 27 (3) (I) THE COMPENSATION FEE PAID IN 2023 SHALL INCLUDE A
- 28 FEE FOR THE USE OF STATE LAND AND WATERWAYS DURING THE 2020 AND 2021
- 29 CALENDAR YEARS.
- 30 (II) THE COMPENSATION FEE UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF
- 31 THIS PARAGRAPH SHALL BE COMPUTED BY MULTIPLYING:

- 1. The megawatt-hours of electricity
- 2 GENERATED BY THE HYDROELECTRIC POWER PLANT DURING 2020 AND 2021,
- 3 RESPECTIVELY;
- 4 2. The average price of a Tier 2 renewable
- 5 ENERGY CREDIT FOR THE 2020 AND 2021 RENEWABLE ENERGY PORTFOLIO
- 6 STANDARD COMPLIANCE YEARS, RESPECTIVELY, AS DETERMINED BY THE
- 7 COMMISSION; AND
- 8 3. 80%.
- 9 (III) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 31, 2023, THE COMMISSION
- 10 SHALL DETERMINE THE AVERAGE PRICE OF A TIER 2 RENEWABLE ENERGY CREDIT
- 11 FOR THE 2020 AND 2021 RENEWABLE ENERGY PORTFOLIO STANDARD COMPLIANCE
- 12 YEARS.
- 13 (D) THE OWNER OF A DAM ASSOCIATED WITH A HYDROELECTRIC POWER
- 14 PLANT MAY NOT APPLY TO OR PETITION THE COMMISSION TO INCREASE THE
- 15 HYDROELECTRIC POWER PLANT'S ELECTRICITY RATES AS A MEANS OF OFFSETTING
- 16 THE COST OF THE COMPENSATION FEE IMPOSED UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 17 (E) THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT SHALL TRANSFER REVENUE
- 18 GENERATED FROM THE COMPENSATION FEE UNDER THIS SECTION TO THE
- 19 CHESAPEAKE BAY TRUST TO BE USED AS FOLLOWS:
- 20 (1) 25% OF THE REVENUE FOR THE ADMINISTRATION OF GRANTS FOR
- 21 AQUATIC SPECIES RESTORATION; AND
- 22 (2) 75% OF THE REVENUE AS GRANTS TO COUNTY OYSTER
- 23 COMMITTEES FOR PURCHASING OR OBTAINING NATIVE CHESAPEAKE BAY OYSTER
- 24 SHELLS.
- 25 (F) THE COMMISSION AND THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT
- 26 JOINTLY SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS SECTION.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 28 October 1, 2022.
