

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 16 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 17 **Article - Education** 18 19 4-318. 20 (d) (3)(i) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a Baltimore City 21 school police officer whose permanent or temporary assignment is at a school or on school 22property [may] SHALL carry a firearm on the premises of the school to which the officer is 23 assigned before or after regular school hours on school days and on days other than school
