At 4MyCiTy, Our focus is on the Importance of Environmental Sustainability. Primarily the Sustainable Management of Food in relation to reducing food waste. Our program limits the harmful effects caused by food waste on our environment while improving food security for families within our communities. Effectively our program is fighting towards ending hunger while protecting our planet against the harmful effects that food waste causes. 4MyCiTy has distributed over 125 Million pounds of food which is an estimated 104 Million meals to families facing hunger. We have diverted over 15 Million Pounds of Organic waste from landfills & Incinerators to compost sites Since 2018 This is approximately 17114 cars taken off the roads or 6606 metric tons of harmful Co2E avoided.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

This facility will be a remote site to our permanent home located in West Baltimore. It will allow us facilitate another major food waste collection initiative that will help to increase our capacity to process food waste on-site in a city setting. This site when fully operational will have the capacity to facilitate over 1.5 Million pounds of organic waste into usable compost. Our Program is 100% Free for community residents, from FREE food resources to Free composting. This New facility will also become an educational Hub revolving around Environmental sustainability with a primary focus on the Sustainable management of food and food waste. This facility will be projected to start processing around 1.5 Million pounds of organic waste yearly with a growth plan to get to 3 Million pounds of organic waste processing by 2025.
