The Baltimore Humane Society, founded in 1927, saves, protects and cares for thousands of homeless animals in the Baltimore Community each year. Open to the public, we operate a full service Pet Adoption, a low-cost, subsidized Spay, Neuter & Vaccine Clinic, which assists in helping control the epidemic of pet overpopulation and it serves low-income pet owners with quality pet care and vaccinations. In addition, our Baltimore Humane Society Pet Cemetery, located on the grounds of BHS, providing a beautiful resting place for pets offering burial, funeral, and cremation services, free pet bereavement services for pet owners and special memorial events. Three hundred and forty three acres of our land still serves as a protected wildlife sanctuary, alive with deer, fox, several species of birds, and numerous other types of local wildlife.

## **11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

This unique, first of a kind project requires the restoration, renovation, and construction of an addition to the 1850's circa home of our founder, Elsie Barton, which resides on the shelter grounds. The project will provide a safe and caring temporary housing for pets owners that experience sudden life crisis situations such as Hospice Patients, health issues and Victims of Domestic Abuse. The program will provide a Real-Life home environment for dogs and cats that will be cared for with live in staff from the Humane Society. The original integrity of the home will be preserved including exterior and interior stone walls, facade, support walls and beams, wood floors, fireplaces and all mature trees surrounding the property. The updated interior and new addition to the home was carefully designed by WBCM Architects, the Humane Society Board and staff members to provide the safest and most comfortable living space to house multiple animals.
