10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

The Calvert Marine Museum is a public, non-profit, educational, regionally-oriented museum dedicated to the collection, preservation, research and interpretation of the cultural and natural history of Southern Maryland. The museum is open seven-days-a-week, year round. There are three permanent exhibits that interpret the three themes of paleontology, estuarine biology, and maritime history: Clues from the Cliffs, River to Bay (which includes a 13-tank aquarium), and The Patuxent: A River and its People. The museum offers educational programming for all ages; public events and festivals; lectures and performances. In 2018 the State of Maryland designated the Calvert Marine Museum as the State Paleontology Research and Collections Center.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The Maritime History Gallery at the Calvert Marine Museum (CMM) spans over four centuries of Southern Maryland history from pre-European contact to post-World War II engagement in roughly chronological order. While the content is interesting, it does not accurately reflect all histories that formed the communities of Southern Maryland. Utilizing a brand new interpretive plan developed specifically for this purpose, CMM plans to transform its Maritime History Gallery into a new space complete with modern exhibits and a special focus on maritime history, Native American history, women's history and African American history. By creating an authentic and immersive engagement at CMM, we hope to promote opportunities for other experiences in the region which simultaneously promote our identity and help sustain community partners.
