Creative Suitland Arts Center has envisioned a dynamic and distinct reuse of a property and has emerged as a community asset to build a local creative economy, provide programs to benefit current residents, enhance walkability, and drive a market awareness of the area. A Bond Bill will assist with completing the outdoor performance space, an important asset in pandemic recovery as well as street level activity to signal "something is happening here". This support also allows for enhancements to the theater to meet the need for an active venue to host 200 people for performance and events. The needed equipment includes theater lighting, sound equipment, stage curtains, a projector, and tables. Repairs to the space include an HVAC repair and general carpentry to move temporary walls and structures to open the space. This investment will enhance operations to increase arts education programs, increase staff and contracted artists and teaching artists.

28. Comments

The pandemic shutdown forced our organization to look at other methods of supporting performing artists in a safe space to gather. Through the past year, we have developed a plan to build a stage, activity space, and outdoor studio area, called The Yard. We have offered an outdoor performance series on a temporary stage called the Front Porch Concert Series. This with the success of the Capital Farmers Market and the Poetry & Produce series, support is needed to complete the vision of this dynamic space.

Building this creative space has already begun. Through a grant from the Redevelopment Authority and the National Endowment of the Arts, we were able to: repair the exterior electric supply to restore the parking lot lights, canopy lights, wall lights, and install a power source dedicated to the new stage and future food trucks install a fabulous mural across the entire faade and retaining wall to enliven the entire space create the Parking Lot Mural Project to enliven the asphalt space design and submit the permit for The Yard

For the next phase, we are seeking funds to complete the project including:

Construction of the stage

Installation of 7,500sf of Astroturf for gathering

Surface painting to define the space

Purchase of tables and chairs

Bistro lighting

Installation of planters to create car barriers around the perimeter

Signage

Anticipated activity in The Yard includes:

Weekly classes, such as yoga, line dance, and kick ball to support people of all ages Social events, such as Open Mic and craft beer nights

Community resource to gather for receptions, meetings, and celebrations

Support to local schools for activities and celebrations

Lunch and fitness hours

Additional repairs to the theater and lobby space will provide a welcoming environment for the community to enjoy performances, hold special events, and experience exciting arts activities in the state.
