Anne Arundel County Recreation and Parks is primarily responsible for the provision of a comprehensive system of recreational programs for county residents and the preservation of valuable land in the form of more than 140 parks and sanctuaries. Recreation and Parks is a Department of Anne Arundel County Government.		

**11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

The Crownsville Hospital Center was a State psychiatric hospital operated from 1911 through 2004, and originally designated as the Hospital for the Negro Insane of Maryland. African Americans who died while institutionalized at the Center are buried in a cemetery located on the property. Most grave sites have only numbers indicated on headstones, and the cemetery was disturbed during the construction of I-97. Volunteers have conducted research over more than a decade to identify over 1,600 individuals buried in the cemetery, and annually hold a "Say My Name" ceremony to honor those individuals. The Crownsville Hospital Patient Cemetery Memorial will consist of a wall listing all patients (including birth date, death date, and state) buried in the cemetery in order to provide dignity in death to the patients, and respect and genealogical record for families and communities.
