10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)						

The Baltimore County Dept. of Recreation and Parks provides a wide range of recreational opportunities to the citizens and visitors of the County, through hundreds of parks and recreation sites countywide. Recreational facilities are provided at parks, leased recreation sites, and public school recreation centers-- the latter through a joint-use agreement whereby many indoor and outdoor facilities at public schools are used for both educational and recreational purposes. The Department administers a wide range of parks, from countywide parks up to 1,100-acres in size, to small neighborhood "pocket parks" of less than an acre. The parks feature a wide variety of facilities and free-time recreational opportunities, and hundreds of organized recreation programs are provided through 45 non-profit recreation and parks councils formed by volunteers.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The proposed project consists of renovations and enhancements at Hamiltowne Park, a 1.7 - acre neighborhood park in the Rosedale community of eastern Baltimore County. Hamiltowne Park is an older era site that features playground equipment and a water fountain (both at the end of their life cycles) and a short sidewalk that dead ends at a grassy area at the edge of the park. The proposed project - funding allowing - would replace the playground and water fountain with modern equipment, update security lighting, and add sidewalks/paved paths to connect park facilities with multiple accesses to the park.

28. Comments
Small neighborhood parks such as Hamiltowne Park are the lifeblood of the County's park system, providing walk-to recreational opportunities in the County's urbanized areas. Such parks provide recreational opportunities to those who lack easy access to transportation, and provide nearby "escapes" that support both physical and mental health. Baltimore County is making the renovation and enhancement of such local parks a high priority, to ensure that the older parks in established communities and neighborhoods serve as valued assets, rather than worn-out, semi-functional sites that can become eyesores. Efforts are also being made to provide universal access, and Hamiltowne Parks is lacking in the area of access, having only an old, short sidewalk that ends in a grassy area and does not connect with the park's recreational facilities. The addition of sidewalks or paved paths will be a key aspect of the proposed park improvements, significantly improving access for all, including visitors with limited mobility.
