<b>10. Description and Purpose of Organization</b> (Limit length to visible area)		
<p>Hereford High School (HHS); Baltimore County Public Schools; North Baltimore County State representatives have visited the HHS tennis courts in person, to confirm their extremely poor (beyond repair) condition, which includes foot-width fissures throughout the courts; and a surface that is worn to the asphalt (slippery even when dry), thus a significant, ongoing liability. It is confirmed that the courts have not been resurfaced since 1992. The courts are used by both BCPS and HHS student athletes as well as the community at large, including adults during evening and weekend hours. State representatives have pictures.</p>		

**11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

Tennis Courts Renovation: Remove and dispose existing fence & playing surface. Mill up to 8 of existing asphalt Furnish and install two inches (2") of hot mix base course asphalt, compacted thickness; and 10 black vinyl coated fencing system around the courts to match existing footprint. Furnish and install (1) coat of Acrylic Resurfacer over court surface; and (3) coats Sealer Layout, tape and hand paint Tennis playing lines on Five (5) courts with Acrylic Line Paint. Furnish and install Five (5) sets of Douglas Net Posts & Nets.

**28. Comments**

It bears worth repeating that this is a genuine need; not a want.

It is recommended that tennis courts are resurfaced every 4-8 years (assuming it is well-maintained and has a solid base). We are at 30 (!) years.

The credibility of these needed repairs is confirmed through Maryland state representatives' in-person visits to the HHS tennis courts. They can provide pictures.

Foot-width fissures and a surface worn down to the sub-surface (asphalt) have resulted in a very unsafe facility. The condition is so poor that points have to be continually replayed due to this.

HHS & the Hereford Community have a demonstrated history of not asking for help as much as when it has been truly needed. However, we simply do not have the resources to pay for this.

It is well-known that Hereford High School student athletes have consistently excelled both inside & outside the classroom, reflecting well on the Maryland State Department of Education. This is based on both BCPS & Maryland State Department of Education academic achievement metrics, including college matriculation; as well as winning the 2021 Maryland state championship. Yet they compete on courts that are both dangerous and an embarrassment to all involved in public education.

This should not be the reward for families, parents, and student athletes who place their faith in public education / BCPS / Maryland Public Schools. Bottom line: Besides the liability due to the condition of the courts, it's simply wrong on so many levels. This is a genuine need; not a want.

We humbly ask you for your help. We ask you to reward our faith in the system, and in our state.
