10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)		
<p>Founded in 1975, Irvine is the largest private nonprofit environmental education center in the greater Baltimore region. Our Mission: We all thrive outdoors. We encourage lifelong engagement with the natural world through environmental learning and green living. We inspire people to explore, respect and protect nature. Irvine provides an ideal setting for exploring nature. We provide educational programs for children and families about the importance of environmental stewardship and protection of the natural world. Irvine includes a 17,200 square-foot Environmental Education Building housing an Exhibit Hall, classrooms, animal care room, Nature Preschool, and staff offices. Outside is the Woodland Garden, Outdoor Classroom, Native American Site, Raptor Aviary, Butterfly House and 8 miles of scenic trails.</p>		

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

To construct a new building adjacent to the main center and to perform upgrades to the existing facilities. This 8,550 square foot expansion at Irvine includes: a new Nature Preschool facility with multiple classrooms; new educational programming and event space; new Butterfly House and Kids' Discovery Room; a redesign of existing Exhibition Hall, and an expansion of Animal Care facilities. The construction of this additional building and the upgrading of the existing one not only provides opportunities for the expansion of programming and events, but also enhances the visitor experience, solidifies Irvine's position as a key destination for nature-based experiences, and provides Irvine with flexibility for growth in the future.
