28. Comments

The Kent Ag Center, Inc. is a non profit organization that leases the property from the Kent County Government in thirty year increments. The Kent Ag Center is home to the Annual Spring Auction In April which helps to financially support our county fair, The Kent County Fair in July and our Annual Touch a Truck Ag Fest which had its debut in October ,as a no fee event to give back to the community. This event raised over \$1500 in donations that were designated for our building fund.

The county has been very helpful financially in the past two years in helping us with the asbestos abatement and removal of two buildings that were deemed unsafe. The Kent County Commissioners designated funds and helped with the asbestos abatement and demolition of the two existing buildings. This was over \$100,000. The Kent Ag Center has paid for our new pole building that we placed on the existing slab of concrete - the cost for this has been in excess of \$59,000. We still need to add an additional 3-5 inches of concrete to the existing pad to make it safe for the public to walk on. This is including sidewalks and handicapped access ramps. We have reached out to the KentCounty Commissioners to see if there are any funds in the budget to help us with this project. They agreed on Feb 15, 2022 to funding \$41,710 to help us complete the pole building that was erected this past year.

We were not able to replace the second building that was removed. We have an exisisting pole building, that is currently our poultry barn. We intend to repurpose this barn into a Main Office/First Aid Station with additional storage. When the one building was removed, we lost our office for our county fair. We are currently seeking funding to complete the project of a main office/first aid station utilizing an existing pole building as the main structure. This project is expected to be between \$80-90,000 to completely finish the building. We first must upgrade the electric system to accommodate more circuits, I have been told this could be in excess of \$80,000. Additional funding, if received, will go towards our maintenance on existing buildings. The costs are endless and we would be grateful for any monies that could be allocated to help offset our costs in completing projects as a non-profit organization. We are continuing to work on our building fundraising to eventually have the new multi-purpose building. We have currently almost exhausted our building fund with the pole building we just erected, the prices doubled during covid from when we first started our demolition work.

The Kent Ag Center still has two additional buildings that are the same age of the two removed. The issues that were present in the other two building are also present within these older buildings. The one is our Indoor exhibit building and the second is our kitchen which is the only air conditioned building on our fairgrounds. These two buildings are in constant need of repairs due to existing roof leaks. We also are having to address an aging septic system. Our dream in the future is to one day have a new multi-purpose building that would house our indoor exhibit building and kitchen. Possibly even for banquets and events, such as our annual achievement banquet. We currently have to rent a venue for this event. We also have outdoor barns that are in need of structural repairs. The Kent Ag Center is respectively asking for help with funding for our projects.
