10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)							

The Friends of Historic Linthicum Walks, Inc. preserve, restore, maintain and operate the historic, aesthetic and cultural properties, buildings and furnishings of Historic Linthicum Walks, which is owned by Anne Arundel County. By adapting its historic buildings and grounds for teaching and demonstrating the stewardship of cultural and natural resources, we work to foster the preservation, advancement and welfare of the County. We have been designated a Level 1 Arbnet Arboretum and our grounds host projects of Master Gardners and Pollinator Pathway projects tended by Watershed Stewards. Additionally, we are Eagle Scout project sponsors. Through these efforts as well as our programing, we strive to encourage the appreciation of this extraordinary historic property by the general public.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

A community resource and cultural center, HLW is the hub of this activity and these repairs and restorations are critical to the preservation of the house. 1) Repair/restore crumbling plaster walls, particularly severe throughout the upstairs. 2) Repair/restore mantels/hearths/surrounds throughout the house. 3) Repair/replace all exterior doors/frames/locks. Their current state negatively impacts climate control which further degrades the home's interior. Neither the interior nor the exterior doors seal and light can be seen around them. 4) Repair/restore windows and surrounds throughout the house. 5) Complete Phase II of our archaeological review and begin formal research on the history of enslaved peoples who lived on the property. This will enable us to accurately interpret and present the resulting information to the public. 6) Full interior and exterior painting/calking is necessary.

All repairs and restoration will adhere to the standards of the Maryland Historical Trust and all work will be subject to county approval.

If funds remain following completion of our initial 6 point restoration plan listed in Item #11 above, we would like to respond to a public request. There is interest in clearing and grooming the (approx. one mile) loop around the property to be used as a walking and jogging trail for all ages. Consideration could be given to 'paving' the rustic trail with wood chips and installing small distance markers. Additionally, there is interest in making the trail a true parkour by installing exercise stations at intervals along the course. This unique feature speaks directly to the health and well-being Anne Arundel County's population. Our outdoor areas were extensively used by families during the Covid pandemic which made many realize the value of expanding our ability to host the public on our grounds.
