28. Comments

Montgomery Parks seeks to provide World-Class recreational amenities to park users within the county. Skate Parks have become increasingly popular and residents are asking for local skate boarding facilities. Based on extensive quantitative analysis and community input, the new draft Parks, Recreation, and Open Space (PROS) plan calls on the Parks Department to find opportunities to add skate parks to the park system. In addition, Montgomery Parks is undertaking a holistic park planning effort in the Long Branch area, called the Long Branch Initiative, to identify park needs in the community. In early outreach, we have received requests for a skateboard park in the Long Branch area.

We have identified Long Branch-Arliss as the preferred candidate for a skate park because of the proximity to the library and community center and the need to activate the park with amenities to provide opportunities for physical activity and social interaction. This 6-acre park is co-located with the Long Branch Library and includes a playground, two tennis courts, a basketball court, and shared parking lot. The existing facilities are deteriorating due to age and heavy use, and many have exceeded their projected life cycle.

The skate park will feature elements for all skill-levels, including beginners. It will contain half-pipes, handrails, ramps, stairs, ledges, ramps, bowls, and at least one distinctive custom feature.

This important project will directly address the requests we have received from the skating community and make skateboarding more available for county residents. With assistance from a Capital Grant, this often-requested feature can be realized and enjoyed by the community in Montgomery County and beyond.
