The Long Green Volunteer Fire Company (LGVFC) is a community-based 501c3 non-profit corporation founded in 1930. Its mission is to serve as first responders for fire suppression, rescue and emergency medical services in order to protect the lives and property for the community we serve. LGVFC protects approximately 35 square miles in Baltimore County, with an approximate population of 8,500 citizens and 3,000 residences, as well as numerous high-risk properties including several pre-schools, one public elementary school, one private elementary school, six churches, and a major retirement community with nursing home.

Conversion of the lower hall of the original building from open space to a combination conference/ meeting/training room and offices for our administrative and operational officers who now share one small office in the firehouse.
