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10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)

For five years, a dedicated Board of educators, business professionals and community members have worked diligently to open a Children's Museum in Salisbury. Globally, children's museums have redefined exploration, discovery, investigation, creativity, and engagement, and offer interactive play and great spaces for families to enjoy and spend time together. Minds in Motion is pivoting to provide a mobile museum to travel through Wicomico County. To date Minds in Motion has: 1. Achieved 501 (3)(c) status 2. Developed website and social media platforms 3. Secured grant for feasibility study 4. Established a donor base; raised over \$50,000 in donations 5. Held an annual New Years Day Hot Chocolate 5K fundraiser 6. Been awarded \$15,000 by The Perdue School of Business at SU 7. Secured donation

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The board received a donation of a 72-passenger 2008 Blue Bird school bus in November, 2021. Bids were secured and a budget and drawings were submitted for the consideration of a bond bill application. Minds in Motion would like to launch a mobile museum by the beginning of the 2022-23 academic year. If funded, this mobile museum will travel to underserved neighborhoods, schools, after-school activities, summer camps, community events and birthday parties to help students develop critical thinking skills through hands-on STEM ((science, technology, engineering, and math) based lessons and experiences. Minds in Motion is particularly interested in offering these services to the rural and low-income areas. There are approximately 10,000 school-aged children within the county that will benefit greatly by receiving supplemental learning challenges during the academic year and preventing summer loss during the summer months.

28. Comments

The demographics of the Wicomico County School system project a snapshot of challenges. Just under 2/3 of the population qualify for the federal free and reduced lunch program. The district enrollment of 15,000 is the largest on the Eastern shore of the country. Many parents are working in the service industry with long hours and not nearly enough money to support a family. The local funding allocation is the second to the last in the state. Nearby Ocean City leads the state with the most local funding due to all of the revenue from this highly populated and popular vacation resort frequented by 8 million tourists annually.

The rate of literacy and math proficiency in the elementary schools hovers at 35% in both areas. The scores are considerably lower in the underserved and food insecure elementary schools where poor attendance is common. The college preparedness rate is 22%, woefully deficient for graduating seniors. The graduation rate is an anemic 72%, far below the state average. In 2017, the kindergarten preparedness score was 33% of entering five year old students.

This is a dismal portrait of what Wicomico County strives to produce. Students with low grades, test scores, literacy indicators, graduation rates and college preparedness are at risk for a lifetime of poor job prospects, high unemployment or underemployment, low income, substance abuse, self-esteem issues and relationship problems. Such students become adults who are highly dependent on social safety nets of welfare, food stamps, and subsidized housing. They are much more likely to be dependent on society rather than become a contributing society member paying taxes and investing in a community's well-being.

Minds in Motion is doing their part to improve the future for all children, especially those in under-served neighborhoods. Through working with key stakeholders like the state government, we are asking action in approving this bond bill application and offering the needed \$250,000 to fund the renovation of the traveling museum and purchase the displays for school-aged children to enjoy. We are dedicated to cutting a wide geographical swath, going into all rural and lows-income areas. Our visits and activities will peak student curiosity, increase engagement and lead to the development of higher order thinking skills e.g. drawing conclusions, making inferences, developing the persistence to complete investigations, collaborate with others and apply previously-gained knowledge in daily problem--solving.

Children retain information by talking and participating. "The ones doing the talking are doing the learning" is a common classroom mantra. The state legislature has the ability to make a sizeable contribution to the successful development of children and change their lives for the better. This generation of current underachievers are often victims of a system that has failed them. By supporting this bond bill, the approved funds will pay for this bus overhaul. You will not only add to the likelihood of increased educational proficiency of children but also to their confidence and self esteem, increasing the risk for more extensive goal setting. Tomorrow's leaders are in need of rigor in their learning and your actions have the capacity to realize this goal.
