10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)						

Robert A Pascal Youth and Family Services, Inc. (Pascal), is a 501(c)(3) non-profit behavioral health agency first formed in March 1971. Pascal provides persons experiencing behavioral health and substance use disorder crises with innovative, comprehensive mental health and substance use disorder treatment. Pascal is a premier provider of crisis stabilization services and outpatient behavioral health services in the state of Maryland. Pascal develops and implements specialized treatment to meet the needs of various client profiles and provides these services in such a manner that social, economic, and/or demographic factors do not limit an individual's access to appropriate services. Pascal utilizes a continuum of care so that there is no "wrong door" for any individual seeking assistance.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The purpose of the grant will be used to expand crisis stabilization services in a newly purchased residential home in a community setting to serve veterans and other underserved citizens in crisis from across the state of Maryland. The renovation of this facility will provide additional residential crisis beds and crisis stabilization services. This grant will additionally support an expansion of both behavioral health and substance use services which will be structured to provide access to treatment for vulnerable populations such as low-income and minority households who may face challenges in receiving care. The grant will further serve to support our collaboration with the Anne Arundel County Police Department Reentry & Community Collaboration program with short term housing and behavioral health outpatient services.

28. Comments

Our agency is licensed and three-year CARF accredited in the following programs: Residential Crisis Services (RCS), Intensive Outpatient (IOP), Outpatient Mental Health Center (OMHC), Psychiatric Rehabilitation Program (PRP), Assertive Community Treatment (ACT), Withdrawal Management (WM), and Residential Substance Use Disorder (SUD) levels (3.1/3.3/3.5) inpatient. We are CARF ASAM certified in the following: 3.1, 3.5, and 3.7. Our agency is the first in the state of Maryland to be CARF ASAM certified in 3.1 and the second in the state of Maryland to be CARF ASAM certified in 3.5 and 3.7.

Pascal currently accepts patients from the State Opioid Response (SOR) program which provides access to immediate substance use treatment for patients from Anne Arundel County, as well as the entire state of Maryland which directly reduces the costs of Emergency Departments. Our facility is within a 30-mile radius of multiple hospitals including the following:

AAMC 4.5 miles BWMC 7.8 miles Harbor 16 miles Saint Agnes 17 miles Howard County General 20 miles University of Maryland Laurel Medical Center 15 miles
