10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)							
The Crofton Civic Association, Inc. is a 501(c)(4) non-profit organization that represents the roughly 13,000 residents of the Crofton Special Community Benefit District (CSCBD). The CCA is run by a 9-member popularly elected Board of Directors that oversees the operation of our Town Hall staff and services. The first stated purpose of our charter is to "foster and advance matters deemed to be in the best interest of the community". Our second purpose is to "administer the Tax District". Among those responsibilities is providing recreational activities and maintaining the three public parks within our boundaries.							

## 11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

This project proposes to replace aging and somewhat unsafe playground equipment with safe, modern, and inclusive designs at two parks owned by the CCA -- Swann Park, adjacent to AA County's Crofton Natural Area, and Willows Park at Old Willow Way and Middle Bridge Ct. These playgrounds are easily accessible without crossing Rt 3, 424 or 450 from neighborhoods surrounding Crofton Parkway. The CCA's Parks Rejuvination Committee has conducted a community-wide survey to gauge stakeholder preferences and has developed a master plan. Our goal is to provide playgrounds that serve all users and improves access and inclusivity for those with disabilities. The CCA has been budgeting for this project for several years and will have \$50,000 to contribute in FY23, but with our 4% annual budget cap, it would be many years before we could complete this on our own. Funds from this bond initiative would accelerate these efforts and allow a major improvement in the near term.

## 28. Comments

There are 3,294 residences within the Crofton Special Community Benefit District, consisting of 2,606 single family homes/townhouses, and 688 apartments. Many additional residences outside the CSCBD are in close proximity to these parks and being part of the Benefit District is not required for use. People of a wide range of ages visit the parks; parents and grandparents bring small children to the playgrounds, older kids and teenagers independently explore the areas without crossing Rt 3, 450, or 424, and adults visit the parks for exercise, enjoying nature, and walking dogs.

These improvements will increase the capacity, safety, and accessibility of the park. We anticipate an increase in park usage following improvements, but do not meter or track the number of users. We are striving to provide inclusive experiences for kids of varying abilities/disabilities to play together in safe environments close to home.

The current equipment was installed in 1998 and the Crofton Civic Association has maintained the equipment in safe working condition to the extent possible. Several of the units, however, are no longer supported by the manufacturer, making repairs difficult if not impossible. Town Hall staff and the CCA Maintenance committee monitors the parks and responds to user complaints. The Park is currently maintained with a mix of community volunteers and paid contractors. Routine upkeep is performed by a landscaping contractor, and the CCA Maintenance Committee holds twice-yearly volunteer events to tackle larger projects. Groups including local scouts and the Crofton Village Garden Club have contributed expertise and labor toward these well-attended events. A local scout troop has also volunteered to complete larger projects such as fence and playground border replacement. These efforts bring the community together while ensuring our investment in Swann Park and Willows Park continues to provide benefit to our residents for many years.

The CCA has explored other sources of funding at both the County and State levels, including DNR's Community Parks and Playgrounds program, but has been denied assistance due to our non-municipality status.
