10. Description and Purpose of Organization (Limit length to visible area)							

Mission Statement: Our mission is to work with the Maryland Department of Natural Resources and the Elk Neck State Park staff to maintain the Turkey Point Lighthouse and oil house. Increase public awareness and educate current and future generations concerning the history of Turkey Point Light Station and the keepers of the light. Raise funds to rebuild the Keeper's House, Carriage House and the Bell Tower and operate them as a part of a living museum for educational purposes. Protect the historic integrity of the Light Station while protecting the environment.

11. Description and Purpose of Project (Limit length to visible area)

The purpose of this project is to reconstruct the Bell Tower to its configuration as built in 1888. The Bell Tower is an important educational and historical structure that will help visitors to the site fully understand the working of the light station. The Bell Tower was destroyed by Coast Guard in the late 1940's due to poor condition. The Bell Tower was a critical component of the Turkey Point Light Station since it provided the only navigational guidance during foggy conditions on the upper bay. Turkey Point Light Station, INC (TPLS Inc) has researched the drawings used to construct the Bell Tower in 1888. Working with the Maryland Historical Trust, both parties agreed on the original single story design. As a footnote, a second story was added during WWII to enable the Coast Guard to scan for enemy subs. Architectural drawings have been completed for a two story design, they will need to slightly modified to remove the second story. (Continued in Block 28).

Block 11 continued. The Maryland Historical Trust has approved the project contingent on review of the detailed engineering drawings which the TPLS Inc is in the process of obtaining. The Maryland Park Service has also given approval for this project. Once final engineering drawings have been completed a contract to build will be let to the appropriate construction services.

Block 12. There is no acquisition costs because this project will be constructed on State Park Property. TPLS, INC has a current operating Lease agreement with the Maryland Park Service that was entered into on Nov, 15, 2006, for a 30 year period.

Block 15.TPLS, Inc had previously pledged \$50,000 of donated funds towards this project, however since that time costs have more than doubled and without this bond grant the project is in jeopardy. TPLS also has plans to reconstruct the Carriage House and the Keepers House as funds become available.

Blocks 16/17: Currently visitation is somewhat restricted due to the lack of adequate parking at the site. However the State Park is currently in the process of under taking a major parking lot project which should allow for increased visitation to the site along with a new path and the draw of the Bell Tower.

Block 23. There is no appraisal because the project will be constructed on state park property and no property is being acquired.
