The Town of University Park is an incorporated municipality located along the Route 1 corridor of northwestern Prince George's County. The Town was incorporated in 1936. The Town provides police, public works, code enforcement and many recreational opportunities to its residents. The Town has a large wooded park, tennis courts, and playing fields that are maintained by the Town. University Park provides a "small town" atmosphere with urban convenience and amenities.
