- 1 have lived apart, without cohabitation and without interruption:
- 2 (i) under a written separation agreement executed by the person 3 and the spouse; or
- 4 (ii) for at least 3 months immediately before the alleged rape or 5 sexual offense; or
- 6 (2) the person in committing the crime uses force or threat of force and the 7 act is without the consent of the spouse.
- 8 (c) A person may be prosecuted under § 3–303, § 3–304, § 3–307, or § 3–308 of 9 this subtitle for a crime against the person's legal spouse if at the time of the alleged crime 10 the person and the spouse live apart, without cohabitation and without interruption, under 11 a decree of limited divorce.]
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 October 1, 2023.
