2 Vehicle Laws – Horse Riding – Helmet Requirement for Minors

FOR the purpose of prohibiting an adult from allowing certain minors to ride a horse on certain property unless the minor is wearing a helmet that meets certain standards;

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 (a) Every person riding an animal or driving an animal-drawn vehicle on a 16 roadway has all the rights granted to and is subject to all the duties required of the driver 17 of a vehicle by this title, except for those provisions of this title that by their very nature 18 cannot apply.

19 (b) (1) Except in Charles, Worcester, and St. Mary's counties, or as provided 20 in paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person may not ride an animal or drive an 21 animal-drawn vehicle on:

(i) Any divided highway where the posted maximum speed limit is
more than 35 miles per hour; or

1 (ii) Any controlled access highway. $\mathbf{2}$ (2)In Anne Arundel County, a person may ride an animal on any part of a highway described in paragraph (1) of this subsection, other than on its roadway or 3 shoulder. 4 IN THIS SUBSECTION, "HORSE" INCLUDES DONKEYS, MULES, AND $\mathbf{5}$ (1) **(C)** 6 PONIES. 7 (2) **(I)** SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, 8 THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY TO HORSE RIDING ON: 9 1. A HIGHWAY; 10 2. A PUBLIC HORSE–RIDING PATH; OR 11 3. ANY OTHER PROPERTY OPEN TO THE PUBLIC OR 12USED BY THE PUBLIC FOR PEDESTRIAN OR VEHICULAR TRAFFIC. 13**(II)** THIS SUBSECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO A MINOR WHO IS: 141. **PRACTICING FOR OR COMPETING OR PERFORMING IN** 15A SHOW OR EVENT WHERE HELMETS ARE NOT HISTORICALLY PART OF THE SHOW OR 16 EVENT; 172. **CROSSING A PUBLIC HIGHWAY THAT SEPARATES** 18 **PRIVATELY OWNED LAND;** 19 3. ENGAGED IN AN AGRICULTURAL PRACTICE OR 20PURSUIT; OR 21**4**. A MEMBER OF AN AMISH OR A MENNONITE 22COMMUNITY. 23AN ADULT WHO IS PRESENT AND DIRECTLY SUPERVISING A (3) 24MINOR MAY NOT ALLOW THE MINOR TO RIDE A HORSE UNLESS THE MINOR IS 25WEARING A PROPERLY SECURED HELMET THAT MEETS OR EXCEEDS THE 26STANDARDS OF THE AMERICAN SOCIETY OF TESTING AND MATERIALS FOR 27PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR USED IN EQUESTRIAN RIDING.

28 (4) A VIOLATION OF THIS SUBSECTION INVOLVING AN ADULT 29 SUPERVISING MULTIPLE MINORS AT THE SAME TIME SHALL BE TREATED AS A 30 SINGLE VIOLATION.

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1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 October 1, 2023.
