- FOR the purpose of providing that voters are eligible for curbside voting under certain
 circumstances; establishing requirements governing curbside voting, including
 requirements related to the establishment of curbside voting locations and how to
 vote at a curbside voting location; and generally relating to curbside voting.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 19 Article Election Law
- 20 1–101.

21 (P-1) "CURBSIDE VOTING" MEANS THE PROCESS BY WHICH AN ELIGIBLE 22 VOTER COMPLETES AND CASTS A BALLOT AT AN OUTSIDE LOCATION DESIGNATED

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CURBSIDE VOTING OUTSIDE THE FOLLOWING:

1	(I) EACH EARLY VOTING CENTER DURING EARLY VOTING; AND

3	1. THE OFFICE OF THE LOCAL BOARD; OR

2526	(2) PROVIDE AN AREA THAT ALLOWS THE VOTER TO OBTAIN INFORMATION FROM CANDIDATES AND OTHERS WHO ARE CAMPAIGNING;

1 (3) PROVIDE A METHOD THAT MAY BE USED BY A VOTER WHO IS 2 REQUESTING CURBSIDE VOTING TO ANNOUNCE THAT THE VOTER HAS ARRIVED AT 3 THE CURBSIDE VOTING LOCATION AND THAT IS NOT:

4 (I) A TELEPHONE SYSTEM REQUIRING THE USE OF A CELL 5 PHONE; OR

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(II) A CALL–AHEAD SYSTEM;

7 (4) ENSURE THAT A PROMPT ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF THE PRESENCE
8 OF A VOTER WHO HAS ARRIVED AT THE CURBSIDE VOTING LOCATION IS PROVIDED
9 BY ELECTION JUDGES; AND

10 (5) ENSURE THAT THE SAME INFORMATION THAT IS PROVIDED TO 11 VOTERS INSIDE AN EARLY VOTING CENTER OR A POLLING PLACE IS TIMELY 12 DELIVERED TO A VOTER DURING CURBSIDE VOTING.

13 (D) (1) AN ELIGIBLE VOTER SEEKING TO USE CURBSIDE VOTING SHALL:

14(I)REQUEST CURBSIDE VOTING FROM AN ELECTION JUDGE AT15THE CURBSIDE VOTING LOCATION; AND

16 (II) PROVIDE AN ELECTION JUDGE WITH THE INFORMATION
17 REQUIRED TO CHECK IN THE VOTER THROUGH THE POLLBOOK AT THE CURBSIDE
18 VOTING LOCATION.

19 (2) AN ELECTION JUDGE SHALL GIVE AN ELIGIBLE VOTER USING 20 CURBSIDE VOTING THE CHOICE TO VOTE BY MARKING A PAPER BALLOT AT THE 21 CURBSIDE VOTING LOCATION OR BY USING A BALLOT MARKING DEVICE INSIDE THE 22 POLLING PLACE.

(3) (1) IF THE ELIGIBLE VOTER CHOOSES TO VOTE USING A PAPER
BALLOT, AFTER MARKING THE BALLOT, THE ELIGIBLE VOTER SHALL DEPOSIT THE
BALLOT IN THE CONTAINER PROVIDED BY THE ELECTION JUDGE.

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(II) THE ELECTION JUDGE SHALL:

271.PLACE THE COMPLETED BALLOT IN THE BALLOT BOX28OR SCANNER INSIDE THE POLLING PLACE; AND

29 **2.** IF THE BALLOT WAS SCANNED, INFORM THE 30 CURBSIDE VOTER THAT THE BALLOT WAS SCANNED AND PROVIDE A RECEIPT, IF 31 PRACTICABLE.

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1 (4) THE ELECTION JUDGES AT A CURBSIDE VOTING LOCATION SHALL 2 MAINTAIN A RECORD OF EACH USE OF CURBSIDE VOTING AT EACH CURBSIDE 3 VOTING LOCATION.

4 (E) NOT LATER THAN 6 MONTHS BEFORE A PRIMARY ELECTION, THE STATE 5 BOARD, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE LOCAL BOARD IN EACH COUNTY, SHALL 6 DESIGNATE EACH CURBSIDE VOTING LOCATION IN THAT COUNTY.

7 (F) THE STATE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THIS 8 SECTION.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 10 October 1, 2023.
