1 (c) The Commission may certify as a police officer an individual who is not 2 considered a police officer under § 3-201(f)(3) of this subtitle if the individual meets the 3 selection and training standards of the Commission.

4 (d) Each certificate issued to a police officer under this subtitle remains the 5 property of the Commission.

6 (e) [As] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (G) OF THIS SECTION, AS a 7 condition of certification, a police officer shall submit to a mental health assessment every 8 2 years and an annual physical agility assessment to establish continuing fitness to carry 9 out the officer's assigned duties as a police officer.

10 (f) Prior cannabis use is not a disqualifier for certification as a police officer.

11(G) AN INDIVIDUAL IS NOT REQUIRED TO SUBMIT TO THE PHYSICAL AGILITY12ASSESSMENT REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION IF THE INDIVIDUAL:

13(1) WAS A POLICE OFFICER, OR THE EQUIVALENT OF A POLICE14OFFICER IN ANOTHER STATE, BEFORE JANUARY 1, 2012; AND

15 (2) AT THE TIME OF APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATION UNDER THIS
 16 SECTION, HAS A CUMULATIVE TOTAL OF AT LEAST 20 YEARS OF SERVICE AS A POLICE
 17 OFFICER, OR THE EQUIVALENT OF A POLICE OFFICER IN ANOTHER STATE.
