# Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority – Evaluation and, Termination of Bond Authority, and Assumption of Functions, Employees, and Contracts (Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority Sunset Act)

 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority from 6 issuing bonds beginning on a certain date; requiring the Department of Legislative 7 Services to conduct an evaluation of the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal 8 Authority; requiring the Maryland Environmental Service and the Maryland Clean 9 Energy Center to review certain aspects of the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal 10 Authority and analyze whether the Maryland Environmental Service or the 11 Maryland Clean Energy Center is able to assume those aspects; requiring the 12 Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority to provide any information the 13Department of Legislative Services, and the Maryland Environmental Service, and 14 <del>the Maryland Clean Energy Center</del> request; requiring the Department of Legislative 15Services, and the Maryland Environmental Service, and the Maryland Clean Energy 16 Center to follow procedures to maintain the confidentiality of certain information, 17documents, and proceedings; requiring an entity that assumes certain aspects of the 18 Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority to establish a system for maintaining 19 stakeholder engagement; requiring the Maryland Environmental Service to 20temporarily assume and maintain certain aspects of the Northeast Maryland Waste 21Disposal Authority under certain circumstances and until a certain entity is 22prepared and ready to assume those aspects; and generally relating to the Northeast 23Maryland Waste Disposal Authority.

WHEREAS, The Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority was created by the General Assembly in 1980 as a regional coordinating agency and financing vehicle to assist participating political subdivisions of the State, other public entities, and the private sector of the economy in the provision of adequate waste disposal facilities, including facilities that provide for energy generation and resource recovery and facilities that generate steam, electricity, or other forms of energy from fuels derived from or otherwise related to waste disposal facilities; and

18 WHEREAS, The Maryland Environmental Service was created by the General 19Assembly in 1970 to provide dependable, effective, and efficient water supply and 20purification and disposal of liquid and solid wastes, encourage reductions in the amount of 21waste generated and discharged to the environment, encourage the generation of energy 22and the recovery of useable resources from waste to the extent practicable, promote the 23conservation of energy use, enable and provide for the production of energy from solid 24wastes and renewable and other sources, encourage private sector participation in 25environmental protection, and serve its political subdivisions and economic interests; and

WHEREAS, The Maryland Clean Energy Center was created by the General Assembly in 2008 to encourage the development of clean energy industries in the State, encourage the deployment of clean energy technologies in the State, help attract and retain business activity and commerce in clean energy technology in the State, promote economic development, and promote the health, safety, and welfare of residents of the State; and

31 WHEREAS, The Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority developed 32 waste-to-energy facilities in Harford County, Montgomery County, and Baltimore City; 33 and

34 WHEREAS, The waste-to-energy facility in Harford County closed in 2016; and

WHEREAS, The local government in Montgomery County stated an intention to close the waste-to-energy facility in the county, the contract for which terminates in April 2026; and

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1 WHEREAS, Baltimore City's contract to send trash to the waste-to-energy facility 2 in Baltimore City terminates in December 2031, and Baltimore County's contract to send 3 trash to the waste-to-energy facility in Baltimore City terminates in September 2026; and

WHEREAS, On formation of the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority in 1980, the General Assembly contemplated that, under the appropriate conditions, the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority could merge into the Maryland Environmental Service under § 3–924 of the Natural Resources Article; and

8 WHEREAS, In its December 2021 report, the State Transparency and Accountability 9 Reform Commission recommended that each agency the Commission reviewed, including 10 the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority, should undergo a review at least once 11 every 8 years, conducted by the legislature and similar to a sunset review, to assess the 12 agency's statutory compliance with its mission and vision; and

13 WHEREAS, A 2017 report, Written Report of George D. Thurston Regarding the 14 Public Health Impacts of Air Emissions From the Wheelabrator Facility, found that air 15 pollution from the Baltimore Refuse Energy Systems Company waste-to-energy facility 16 causes \$55 million in health damages annually for the region; and

WHEREAS, An analysis by the Environmental Integrity Project demonstrates that
 Maryland's two remaining waste-to-energy facilities emit significantly more mercury and
 nitrogen oxides per unit of energy than the State's remaining coal plants; and

20WHEREAS, In Appendix E of its December 2021 report, the State Transparency and 21Accountability Reform Commission states, "It was brought to the Commission's attention 22that the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority (NMWDA) has a provision within 23its statute (Natural Resources Section 3-924) that allows them to merge within the 24Maryland Environmental Services (MES). Given that, to the Commission's knowledge, 25NMWDA does not have any outstanding bonds, it may be appropriate to consolidate them 26into MES since their work overlaps. This could help eliminate any redundancies and 27integrate the efforts of both agencies to better serve the state."; now, therefore,

28 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 29 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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# Article – Natural Resources

31 3–905.

32 (a) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 3–907.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE 33 Authority is granted and has and may exercise all powers necessary for carrying out the 34 purposes of this subtitle, including but not limited to, the following rights and powers:

- (1) To have perpetual existence as a corporation;

1 (2) To adopt bylaws, rules, regulations, policies, and procedures for the 2 regulation of its affairs and the conduct of its business;

12 (8) To acquire, purchase, hold, lease as lessee, and use any franchise, 13 patent or license and any property (real, personal or mixed or tangible or intangible), or 14 any interest therein, necessary or convenient for carrying out the purposes of the Authority;

15 (9) To sell, lease as lessor, transfer, and dispose of any property or interest 16 therein at any time acquired by it;

17To acquire, either directly or by or through any person or political (10)subdivision, by purchase or by gift or devise such lands, structures, property (real or 1819personal) rights, rights-of-way, franchises, easements and other interests in lands, 20including lands lying under water and riparian rights which are located within or without 21the State as it may deem necessary or convenient for the construction or operation of a 22project, upon such terms and at such prices as may be considered by it to be reasonable and 23can be agreed upon by it and the owner thereof, and to take title thereto in the name of the 24Authority:

25To borrow money and to issue bonds for the purpose of paying all or any (11)26part of the cost of any one or more projects or for any other corporate purpose of the 27Authority; to secure the payment of such borrowing or any part thereof by pledge of or 28mortgage or deed of trust on all or any part of its properties or revenues; to combine projects 29for financing or operating purposes; to make agreements with or for the benefit of the purchasers or holders of bonds or with others in connection with the issuance of any such 30 31 bonds, whether issued or to be issued, as the Authority may deem advisable; and in general 32to provide for the security of such bonds and the rights of the holders thereof;

33 (12) To take and hold title to any project which may be transferred to the 34 Authority, and to assume jurisdiction over and provide for the maintenance and operation 35 of said project, all on such terms as may be mutually agreed upon between the Authority 36 and the transferor. The Authority may contract with any subdivision to assume the 37 payment of the principal of and interest on obligations or indebtedness of such subdivision

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incurred in connection with any project and may undertake to operate any project in such a manner as to provide for the payment of all outstanding obligations or indebtedness applicable to such project and the interest thereon and to transfer to the appropriate subdivision an amount equal to the debt service payments prior to the applicable payment date;

6 (13) To fix and revise from time to time and to collect rates, rentals, fees, 7 and charges for the use of or for services and facilities provided or made available by the 8 Authority;

9 (14) To make and enter into contracts with the federal or any state 10 government (or any agency, instrumentality or subdivision thereof) or with any subdivision 11 or person within or without the State of Maryland providing for or relating to the 12 acquisition, construction, management, operation, and maintenance of any project or the 13 furnishing of services by or to any project or in connection with the services of any project 14 owned, operated, or controlled by the other contracting party; such contracts may make 15 provision for:

16 (i) The payment by the other contracting party to the Authority of a 17 fixed amount for the collection, processing, or disposal of a stated amount of waste (whether 18 or not the stated amount of waste is collected, processed or disposed of), or of all or any 19 portion of the operating expenses of one or more projects;

20 (ii) The utilization by the other contracting party of one or more 21 projects for the processing or disposal of all or any portion of waste over which such party 22 has control;

(iii) The collection by the other contracting party or its agents or by
agents of the Authority of fees, rates or charges for the services and facilities rendered to a
subdivision or the inhabitants thereof, and for the enforcement of delinquent charges for
such services and facilities; or

(iv) The abandonment or restriction or prohibition of the construction or operation of competing facilities. The provisions of any such contract with a subdivision shall be deemed to be for the benefit of bondholders as designated by the Authority and may be made irrevocable so long as any bonds of the Authority secured by such contract shall be outstanding;

(18) To make rules and regulations pertaining to the Authority and projects,
which rules and regulations may (without limitation) exclude or require preconditioning of
any waste that might otherwise be harmful to the project or its efficient operation or
endanger the health or safety of workers or others;

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[The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 3-907.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE 1 (a)  $\mathbf{2}$ Authority is hereby authorized and empowered, by resolution, to issue bonds for the 3 purpose of financing the cost of one or more projects or for any other corporate purpose. Except as may otherwise be expressly provided by the Authority, every issue of its bonds 4 shall be general obligations of the Authority payable from any revenues or money of the  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Authority available therefor and not otherwise pledged, subject only to any agreements 7 with holders of particular bonds pledging any particular revenues or money and to any agreements with any persons or subdivisions. The Authority may issue its bonds without 8 9 obtaining the consent of any board, agency, department or unit of the State, and without any other proceedings or the happening of any conditions or things other than those 10 specifically required hereunder. The Authority and the Maryland Environmental Service 11 12may enter into agreements providing for (i) the financing by the issuance of bonds of the 13Maryland Environmental Service of projects provided for any subdivision by the Authority 14or (ii) the financing by the issuance of bonds of the Authority of projects provided for any 15subdivision by the Maryland Environmental Service.
