# A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

# Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority – Evaluation and Termination of Bond Authority (Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority Sunset Act)

 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of prohibiting the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority from 6 issuing bonds beginning on a certain date; requiring the Department of Legislative 7 Services to conduct an evaluation of the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal 8 Authority; requiring the Maryland Environmental Service and the Maryland Clean 9 Energy Center to review certain aspects of the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority and analyze whether the Maryland Environmental Service or the 10 11 Maryland Clean Energy Center is able to assume those aspects; requiring the 12Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority to provide any information the 13 Department of Legislative Services, the Maryland Environmental Service, and the 14 Maryland Clean Energy Center request; requiring the Department of Legislative Services, the Maryland Environmental Service, and the Maryland Clean Energy 1516 Center to follow procedures to maintain the confidentiality of certain information, 17documents, and proceedings; and generally relating to the Northeast Maryland 18 Waste Disposal Authority.

## Preamble

WHEREAS, The Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority was created by the General Assembly in 1980 as a regional coordinating agency and financing vehicle to assist participating political subdivisions of the State, other public entities, and the private sector of the economy in the provision of adequate waste disposal facilities, including facilities that provide for energy generation and resource recovery and facilities that generate steam, electricity, or other forms of energy from fuels derived from or otherwise related to waste disposal facilities; and

9 WHEREAS, The Maryland Environmental Service was created by the General 10 Assembly in 1970 to provide dependable, effective, and efficient water supply and purification and disposal of liquid and solid wastes, encourage reductions in the amount of 11 12waste generated and discharged to the environment, encourage the generation of energy 13and the recovery of useable resources from waste to the extent practicable, promote the conservation of energy use, enable and provide for the production of energy from solid 1415wastes and renewable and other sources, encourage private sector participation in 16environmental protection, and serve its political subdivisions and economic interests; and

WHEREAS, The Maryland Clean Energy Center was created by the General Assembly in 2008 to encourage the development of clean energy industries in the State, encourage the deployment of clean energy technologies in the State, help attract and retain business activity and commerce in clean energy technology in the State, promote economic development, and promote the health, safety, and welfare of residents of the State; and

22 WHEREAS, The Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority developed 23 waste-to-energy facilities in Harford County, Montgomery County, and Baltimore City; 24 and

25 WHEREAS, The waste-to-energy facility in Harford County closed in 2016; and

WHEREAS, The local government in Montgomery County stated an intention to close the waste-to-energy facility in the county, the contract for which terminates in April 28 2026; and

WHEREAS, Baltimore City's contract to send trash to the waste-to-energy facility in Baltimore City terminates in December 2031, and Baltimore County's contract to send trash to the waste-to-energy facility in Baltimore City terminates in September 2026; and

WHEREAS, On formation of the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority in 1980, the General Assembly contemplated that, under the appropriate conditions, the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority could merge into the Maryland Environmental Service under § 3–924 of the Natural Resources Article; and

WHEREAS, In its December 2021 report, the State Transparency and Accountability
 Reform Commission recommended that each agency the Commission reviewed, including
 the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority, should undergo a review at least once

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every 8 years, conducted by the legislature and similar to a sunset review, to assess the
agency's statutory compliance with its mission and vision; and

3 WHEREAS, A 2017 report, Written Report of George D. Thurston Regarding the 4 Public Health Impacts of Air Emissions From the Wheelabrator Facility, found that air 5 pollution from the Baltimore Refuse Energy Systems Company waste-to-energy facility 6 causes \$55 million in health damages annually for the region; and

WHEREAS, An analysis by the Environmental Integrity Project demonstrates that
Maryland's two remaining waste-to-energy facilities emit significantly more mercury and
nitrogen oxides per unit of energy than the State's remaining coal plants; and

10 WHEREAS, In Appendix E of its December 2021 report, the State Transparency and Accountability Reform Commission states, "It was brought to the Commission's attention 11 12that the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority (NMWDA) has a provision within 13 its statute (Natural Resources Section 3–924) that allows them to merge within the 14Maryland Environmental Services (MES). Given that, to the Commission's knowledge, 15NMWDA does not have any outstanding bonds, it may be appropriate to consolidate them 16 into MES since their work overlaps. This could help eliminate any redundancies and 17integrate the efforts of both agencies to better serve the state."; now, therefore,

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,
 19 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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## Article – Natural Resources

21 3–905.

22 (a) [The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 3–907.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE 23 Authority is granted and has and may exercise all powers necessary for carrying out the 24 purposes of this subtitle, including but not limited to, the following rights and powers:

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(1) To have perpetual existence as a corporation;

26 (2) To adopt bylaws, rules, regulations, policies, and procedures for the 27 regulation of its affairs and the conduct of its business;

28 (3) To adopt an official seal and alter the same at pleasure;

(4) To maintain an office or offices at such place or places as it may

30 designate;

31 (5) To appoint officers, agents and employees, and to prescribe their duties 32 and to fix their compensation as set forth in this subtitle;

33 (6) To sue and be sued in its own name;

1 (7) To acquire, construct, reconstruct, rehabilitate, improve, maintain, 2 equip, lease (as lessor or as lessee), repair, and operate projects within or without the State 3 of Maryland and to establish reasonable rules and regulations relating to any project;

4 (8) To acquire, purchase, hold, lease as lessee, and use any franchise, 5 patent or license and any property (real, personal or mixed or tangible or intangible), or 6 any interest therein, necessary or convenient for carrying out the purposes of the Authority;

7 (9) To sell, lease as lessor, transfer, and dispose of any property or interest
8 therein at any time acquired by it;

9 (10)To acquire, either directly or by or through any person or political 10 subdivision, by purchase or by gift or devise such lands, structures, property (real or 11 personal) rights, rights-of-way, franchises, easements and other interests in lands, 12including lands lying under water and riparian rights which are located within or without 13 the State as it may deem necessary or convenient for the construction or operation of a 14project, upon such terms and at such prices as may be considered by it to be reasonable and 15can be agreed upon by it and the owner thereof, and to take title thereto in the name of the 16 Authority:

17To borrow money and to issue bonds for the purpose of paying all or any (11)18 part of the cost of any one or more projects or for any other corporate purpose of the 19Authority; to secure the payment of such borrowing or any part thereof by pledge of or 20mortgage or deed of trust on all or any part of its properties or revenues; to combine projects 21for financing or operating purposes; to make agreements with or for the benefit of the purchasers or holders of bonds or with others in connection with the issuance of any such 2223bonds, whether issued or to be issued, as the Authority may deem advisable; and in general 24to provide for the security of such bonds and the rights of the holders thereof;

25(12)To take and hold title to any project which may be transferred to the 26Authority, and to assume jurisdiction over and provide for the maintenance and operation 27of said project, all on such terms as may be mutually agreed upon between the Authority 28and the transferor. The Authority may contract with any subdivision to assume the 29payment of the principal of and interest on obligations or indebtedness of such subdivision incurred in connection with any project and may undertake to operate any project in such 30 a manner as to provide for the payment of all outstanding obligations or indebtedness 3132applicable to such project and the interest thereon and to transfer to the appropriate 33 subdivision an amount equal to the debt service payments prior to the applicable payment 34date;

(13) To fix and revise from time to time and to collect rates, rentals, fees,
and charges for the use of or for services and facilities provided or made available by the
Authority;

38 (14) To make and enter into contracts with the federal or any state 39 government (or any agency, instrumentality or subdivision thereof) or with any subdivision 40 or person within or without the State of Maryland providing for or relating to the

acquisition, construction, management, operation, and maintenance of any project or the

furnishing of services by or to any project or in connection with the services of any project

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3 owned, operated, or controlled by the other contracting party; such contracts may make 4 provision for:  $\mathbf{5}$ The payment by the other contracting party to the Authority of a (i) 6 fixed amount for the collection, processing, or disposal of a stated amount of waste (whether 7or not the stated amount of waste is collected, processed or disposed of), or of all or any 8 portion of the operating expenses of one or more projects; 9 (ii) The utilization by the other contracting party of one or more 10 projects for the processing or disposal of all or any portion of waste over which such party 11 has control: 12(iii) The collection by the other contracting party or its agents or by agents of the Authority of fees, rates or charges for the services and facilities rendered to a 1314subdivision or the inhabitants thereof, and for the enforcement of delinquent charges for 15such services and facilities; or 16 (iv) The abandonment or restriction or prohibition of the construction 17or operation of competing facilities. The provisions of any such contract with a subdivision 18 shall be deemed to be for the benefit of bondholders as designated by the Authority and 19may be made irrevocable so long as any bonds of the Authority secured by such contract 20shall be outstanding: 21To make and enter into all contracts or agreements which the Authority (15)22determines are necessary or incidental to the performance of its duties and to the execution 23of the purposes of and the powers granted by this subtitle, including (without limitation) 24contracts relating to: 25(i) The use or management by the other contracting party of any 26project or the services therefrom or the facilities thereof; 27The use by the Authority of the services or facilities of any project (ii) 28owned, leased, operated or controlled by the other contracting party; 29(iii) The sale of any fuel, steam, electricity, energy, or other material 30 or resource derived from the operation of any project; 31 The acceptance, processing and disposal of wastes by one or more (iv) 32projects; or 33 (v) The employment or retention of consulting and other engineers, 34superintendents, financial advisors, attorneys, accountants, and such other employees, 35 advisors or agents as in the judgment of the Authority may be deemed necessary or 36 desirable:

1 (16) To enter with the permission of the owner upon lands, waters, or 2 premises for the purpose of making surveys, soundings, borings, and examinations to 3 accomplish any purpose authorized by this subtitle, the Authority being liable for any 4 actual damage done;

 $\mathbf{5}$ To make application for, receive and accept from the federal or any state (17)6 government (or any agency, instrumentality, or subdivision thereof) or from any person 7 grants relating to the Authority or any project, including (without limitation) grants for or 8 in aid of the planning, financing, construction, acquisition, maintenance, or operation of 9 any project; to receive and accept aid or contributions from any source, whether in the form of money or property, labor, or other things of value; and to participate in any price support 10 11 program, loan program or other program of the federal or State government relating to 12waste disposal, resource recovery or energy generation;

13 (18) To make rules and regulations pertaining to the Authority and projects, 14 which rules and regulations may (without limitation) exclude or require preconditioning of 15 any waste that might otherwise be harmful to the project or its efficient operation or 16 endanger the health or safety of workers or others;

17To enter into agreements with the Maryland Environmental Service (19)providing for the assumption by the Maryland Environmental Service of such activities of 1819the Authority as the Authority may deem necessary or desirable to effectuate its purposes, 20including agreements relating to the exchange of information between the Authority and 21the Maryland Environmental Service, the sharing of planning resources, the provision by 22the Maryland Environmental Service of personnel, consulting services and technical 23assistance to the Authority, and the acquisition, construction, supervision, operation or 24maintenance of one or more projects by the Maryland Environmental Service; and

25 (20) To do all things necessary to carry out its purposes and for the exercise 26 of the powers granted in this subtitle.

28[The] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 3-907.1 OF THIS SUBTITLE, THE (a) 29Authority is hereby authorized and empowered, by resolution, to issue bonds for the 30 purpose of financing the cost of one or more projects or for any other corporate purpose. 31 Except as may otherwise be expressly provided by the Authority, every issue of its bonds 32shall be general obligations of the Authority payable from any revenues or money of the 33 Authority available therefor and not otherwise pledged, subject only to any agreements 34 with holders of particular bonds pledging any particular revenues or money and to any 35 agreements with any persons or subdivisions. The Authority may issue its bonds without 36 obtaining the consent of any board, agency, department or unit of the State, and without 37 any other proceedings or the happening of any conditions or things other than those 38 specifically required hereunder. The Authority and the Maryland Environmental Service 39 may enter into agreements providing for (i) the financing by the issuance of bonds of the 40 Maryland Environmental Service of projects provided for any subdivision by the Authority

or (ii) the financing by the issuance of bonds of the Authority of projects provided for any
subdivision by the Maryland Environmental Service.

(3) whether continuation of the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal
Authority is necessary for the public interest, including whether the Northeast Maryland
Waste Disposal Authority's statutory purpose serves the needs of the State;

(4) whether the systems for procurements and awarding of contracts by the
 Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority have created any conflicts of interest;

(5) whether the operations of the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal
Authority have led to a reduction in waste sent to incinerators and landfills in its member
jurisdictions;

(6) whether the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal Authority has
 contributed to its member jurisdictions attaining a higher recycling rate under the
 Maryland Recycling Act than the recycling rate for nonmember jurisdictions;

30 (7) whether the operations of the Northeast Maryland Waste Disposal 31 Authority have led to cost savings for the State and, relative to costs for nonmember
