- The certification agency designated by the Board of Public Works under § 14 14–303(b) of the State Finance and Procurement Article and the Governor's Office of Small. 15 Minority, and Women Business Affairs, in consultation with the Department of Housing 16 17 and Community Development, the Office of the Attorney General, and the General 18 Assembly, shall initiate a study regarding the energy efficiency and conservation services used by the Department of Housing and Community Development to evaluate whether the 19 20 enactment of remedial measures to assist minority and women-owned businesses in the 21energy efficiency and conservation services industry and market would comply with the U.S. Supreme Court decision in City of Richmond v. J. A. Croson Co., 488 U.S. 469, and any 2223subsequent federal or constitutional requirements.
- 25 <u>Women Business Affairs shall submit the findings of the study required under subsection</u>
  26 (a) of this section to the Legislative Policy Committee, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the
