1 AN ACT concerning

Creation of a State Debt – Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2023, and the Maryland Consolidated Capital Bond Loans of 2011, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2020, 2021, and 2022

 $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of authorizing the creation of a State Debt in the amount of One Billion, 6 Two Hundred Six Million, Six Hundred Thirty–Nine Thousand Dollars 7 (\$1,206,639,000) One Billion, Two Hundred and Sixteen Million, Six Hundred and Thirty-Nine Thousand Dollars (\$1,216,639,000), the proceeds to be used for certain 8 9 necessary building, construction, demolition, planning, renovation, conversion, 10 replacement, and capital equipment purchases of the State, for acquiring certain real 11 estate in connection therewith, and for grants to certain subdivisions and other 12 organizations for certain development and improvement purposes, subject to certain 13requirements that certain matching funds be provided and expended by certain 14 dates; providing generally for the issuance and sale of bonds evidencing the loan; 15imposing a certain tax on all assessable property in the State; requiring that certain 16 grantees convey certain easements under certain circumstances to the Maryland 17Historical Trust; providing that the proceeds of certain loans must be expended or 18 encumbered by a certain date; authorizing the Board of Public Works, under certain 19 circumstances, to approve certain appropriations, notwithstanding certain technical 20differences; authorizing certain unexpended appropriations in certain prior capital 21budgets and bond loans to be expended for other public projects; altering certain 22requirements for certain programs in certain prior capital budgets and bond loans; 23reducing prior authorizations of State Debt; requiring that certain projects be 24constructed at certain locations; adding, altering, and repealing certain 25requirements for certain appropriations; specifying the use of certain project funds;

5 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND,6 That:

(1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on
behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland
Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 2023 in the total principal amount of \$1,206,639,000
\$1,216,639,000. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State
general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and
issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with §§ 8–117 through 8–124 and 8–131.2 of the
State Finance and Procurement Article.

14 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as a 15 single issue of bonds under § 8–122 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.

16 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer and 17 first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and delivering the 18 bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then shall be credited on 19 the books of the Comptroller and expended on approval by the Board of Public Works, for 20 the following public purposes, including any applicable architects' and engineers' fees:
