BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – Criminal Law Section 11–107 Annotated Code of Maryland (2021 Replacement Volume and 2022 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - Criminal Law 11-107.In this section, "indecent exposure" includes engaging in an act of masturbation in public, whether or not the person's genitalia are exposed.
