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Maryland Forestry Education Fund – Establishment

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Maryland Forestry Education Fund as a special, 4 nonlapsing fund to expand and enhance the Maryland Forestry Foundation's $\mathbf{5}$ capacity to provide certain education and resources to forest landowners, the ability 6 of district forestry boards and the knowledge of local governments to achieve healthy 7 and sustainable forests, and the ability of businesses to test innovative best 8 management practices in forestry; requiring interest earnings of the Fund to be 9 credited to the Fund; and generally relating to the Maryland Forestry Education 10 Fund.

25(I) EXPENDITURES FROM THE FUND MAY BE MADE ONLY IN ACCORDANCE26WITH THE STATE BUDGET.

(J) MONEY EXPENDED FROM THE FUND FOR THE OUTREACH, TRAINING,
EDUCATION, AND GRANTS UNDER SUBSECTION (G) OF THIS SECTION IS
SUPPLEMENTAL TO AND IS NOT INTENDED TO TAKE THE PLACE OF FUNDING THAT
OTHERWISE WOULD BE APPROPRIATED FOR FORESTRY EDUCATION AND
OUTREACH.

1 (K) FOR FISCAL <u>YEAR</u> <u>YEARS</u> 2025 AND <u>EACH FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER</u> 2 <u>2026</u>, THE GOVERNOR SHALL INCLUDE IN THE ANNUAL BUDGET BILL AN 3 APPROPRIATION OF \$250,000 TO THE FUND.

6 (a) (2) (i) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, and unless 7 inconsistent with a federal law, grant agreement, or other federal requirement or with the 8 terms of a gift or settlement agreement, net interest on all State money allocated by the 9 State Treasurer under this section to special funds or accounts, and otherwise entitled to 10 receive interest earnings, as accounted for by the Comptroller, shall accrue to the General 11 Fund of the State.
