Natural Resources - Blue and Flathead Catfish Finfish Trotline License Establishment

- FOR the purpose of establishing a licensing and regulatory scheme to allow the commercial
 fishing of blue and flathead catfish in the tidal waters of the State using a finfish
 trotline; and generally relating to the commercial blue and flathead catfish finfish
 trotline license.

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SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 1 $\mathbf{2}$ That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 3 Article – Natural Resources 4-701. 4 Except as provided in [§ 4–701.1] §§ 4–701.1 AND 4–701.2 of this subtitle, $\mathbf{5}$ (a) this section applies to any person who is required under this subtitle or Subtitle 2, 8, 9, or 6 10 of this title to be licensed to guide fishing parties or to catch, sell, buy, process, transport, 7 8 export, or otherwise deal in fish caught in tidal waters. 9 (b) Except as provided in [§ 4–701.1] §§ 4–701.1 AND 4–701.2 of this (1)subtitle, the Department shall utilize a single, commercial license, to be known and 10 designated as a tidal fish license. 11 12(d) The following annual fees for an authorization shall apply (2)(ii) regardless of when the license is issued or an activity is authorized: 13144. For a person to buy, process, pack, resell, market or otherwise deal in fish caught in the tidal waters of Maryland, seafood dealer: 1516А. \$50 for a person licensed under item 2 of this subparagraph or § 4–701.1 OR § 4–701.2 of this subtitle; or 1718B. \$250 for a person not licensed under item 2 of this 19subparagraph; and 20For a person who is not licensed under this section to land 5. fish caught in out-of-state tidal waters, seafood landing - \$350. 21224-701.2. 23THERE IS A COMMERCIAL BLUE AND FLATHEAD CATFISH FINFISH (A) TROTLINE LICENSE. 2425**(B)** (1) THE LICENSE AUTHORIZES THE HOLDER TO CATCH FOR SALE 26BLUE AND FLATHEAD CATFISH IN THE TIDAL WATERS OF THE STATE USING A 27FINFISH TROTLINE, AS DEFINED IN DEPARTMENT REGULATIONS. 28A LICENSEE SHALL FISH IN ACCORDANCE WITH DEPARTMENT (2) 29**REGULATIONS.**

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1 (C) A PERSON WHO WISHES TO OBTAIN THE LICENSE SHALL COMPLETE AND 2 SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR THE LICENSE TO THE DEPARTMENT OR ANY PERSON 3 DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

4 (D) AN APPLICANT FOR THE LICENSE DOES NOT NEED TO HOLD A TIDAL 5 FISH LICENSE UNDER § 4–701 OF THIS SUBTITLE TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE LICENSE.

6 (E) THE TERM OF THE LICENSE IS 1 YEAR FROM SEPTEMBER 1 THROUGH 7 AUGUST 31 THE FOLLOWING YEAR.

8 (F) THE ANNUAL LICENSE FEE IS \$15.

9 (G) A LICENSEE MAY NOT TRANSFER A LICENSE ISSUED UNDER THIS 10 SECTION.

11 (H) A LICENSEE SHALL HAVE A COMMERCIAL BLUE AND FLATHEAD CATFISH 12 FINFISH TROTLINE LICENSE IN THE LICENSEE'S POSSESSION WHEN THE LICENSEE 13 FISHES UNDER THE LICENSE.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 15 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health or safety, has 16 been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three—fifths of all the members elected to 17 each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is 18 enacted.
