Vehicle Laws - Parking Enforcement - Citations

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring a parking citation issued by a political subdivision or 4 subdivision, a State agency, or a third-party contractor to have printed on it a box 5 that the person issued the citation may check to indicate that the registration plates 6 cited were not issued for the vehicle described in the citation; requiring a political 7 subdivision or subdivision, State agency, or a third-party contractor that receives a parking citation from a person with the box checked to perform a certain 8 9 investigation verification process and dismiss the citation under certain 10 circumstances; prohibiting a person from returning a parking citation to a political 11 subdivision or subdivision, a State agency, or a third-party contractor with the box 12 checked inaccurately; and generally relating to parking enforcement.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, 2 That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Transportation

4 26-301.

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- 5 (a) In this subtitle, "officer" means a police officer or a person other than a police officer who is authorized to issue a citation for a violation of an ordinance or regulation that 7 is adopted under this section.
- 8 (b) Subject to subsection (c) of this section, any State agency authorized by law 9 and any political subdivision of this State may adopt ordinances or regulations that:
- 10 (1) Regulate the parking of vehicles;
- 11 (2) Provide for the impounding of vehicles parked in violation of the 12 ordinances or regulations;
- 13 (3) Regulate the towing of vehicles from publicly owned and privately owned parking lots; and
- 15 (4) Provide for the issuance of a citation by an officer for a violation of an ordinance or regulation that is adopted under this section.

- 18 (a) An officer who discovers a vehicle parked in violation of an ordinance or 19 regulation adopted under this subtitle shall:
- 20 (1) Deliver a citation to the driver or, if the vehicle is unattended, attach a 21 citation to the vehicle in a conspicuous place; and
- 22 (2) Keep a copy of the citation, bearing his certification under penalty of 23 perjury that the facts stated in the citation are true.
- 24 (b) In the absence of the driver, the registered owner of the vehicle is presumed 25 to be the person receiving the citation.
- 26 (C) (1) A CITATION ISSUED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL INCLUDE A BOX 27 THAT THE PERSON ISSUED THE CITATION MAY CHECK TO INDICATE THAT THE 28 REGISTRATION PLATES CITED WERE NOT ISSUED FOR THE VEHICLE DESCRIBED IN 29 THE CITATION.
- 30 (2) A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OR <u>SUBDIVISION</u>, STATE AGENCY, <u>OR</u> 31 THIRD-PARTY CONTRACTOR AUTHORIZED TO CONDUCT PARKING ENFORCEMENT

8	OF THE INVESTIGATION <u>VERIFICATION PROCESS</u> .
9	(3) AFTER AN INVESTIGATION THE VERIFICATION PROCESS
10	INITIATED UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, IF THE POLITICAL
11	SUBDIVISION OR SUBDIVISION, STATE AGENCY, OR THIRD-PARTY CONTRACTOR
12	FINDS THAT THE PERSON ISSUED THE CITATION SHOULD NOT BE HELD LIABLE FOR
13	THE CITATION, THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OR SUBDIVISION, STATE AGENCY, OR
14	THIRD-PARTY CONTRACTOR SHALL DISMISS THE CITATION.
15	(4) A PERSON MAY NOT SUBMIT A CITATION WITH THE BOX CHECKED
16	AS INDICATED IN PARAGRAPH (1) OF THIS SUBSECTION TO A POLITICAL
17	SUBDIVISION OR SUBDIVISION, STATE AGENCY, OR THIRD-PARTY CONTRACTOR IF
18	THE REGISTRATION PLATES CITED WERE ISSUED FOR THE VEHICLE DESCRIBED IN
19	THE CITATION.
