5 FOR the purpose of altering the definition of “hearing aid dispensing” to include certain
6 actions taken for the purpose of ordering certain hearing instruments and specifying
7 that certain hearing instruments include prescription hearing aids; altering the
8 definition of “practice audiology” for the purposes of certain provisions of law
9 governing the licensure of audiologists; providing that certain provisions of law do
10 not apply to certain actions taken with respect to certain over–the–counter hearing
11 aids; and generally relating to the ~~practice of audiology~~ Maryland Audiology,
12 Hearing Aid Dispensing, Speech–Language Pathology, and Music Therapy Act.

23 (h) (1) “Hearing aid dispensing” means performing, conducting, and
 24 interpreting hearing assessment procedures to determine the type and extent of hearing
 25 loss for the purpose of:

26 (i) Fitting AND ORDERING suitable hearing instruments,
 27 INCLUDING PRESCRIPTION HEARING AIDS;

28 (ii) Selecting suitable hearing instruments;

29 (iii) Programming a hearing aid by selecting and determining the
 30 frequency response, compression, output, gain, or other parameters of the hearing aid for
 31 initial wear by an individual or any required alterations throughout the use of the hearing
 32 aid;

33 (iv) Making ear molds or ear impressions; and

34 (v) Providing appropriate counseling.

1 (2) “Hearing aid dispensing” includes:

2 (i) An act pertaining to the ORDERING, selling, renting, leasing, or
3 delivering of a hearing instrument, INCLUDING A PRESCRIPTION HEARING AID; and

4 (ii) Providing maintenance or repair services for a hearing aid.

6 (1) **APPLY** the principles, methods, and procedures of measurement,
7 prediction, evaluation, testing, counseling, consultation, and instruction that relate to the
8 development and disorders of hearing, vestibular functions, and related language and
9 speech disorders, to ~~prevent or modify the disorders or assist individuals in hearing and~~
10 ~~auditory and related skills for communication.] ~~ORDER, EVALUATE, DIAGNOSE,~~~~
11 ~~MANAGE, OR TREAT ANY AUDITORY OR VESTIBULAR CONDITION IN THE HUMAN EAR;~~

13 (2) [“Practice audiology” includes the fitting or selling of] **PRESCRIBE,**
14 **ORDER, SELL, DISPENSE, OR FIT** hearing aids ~~OR OSSEO-INTEGRATED DEVICES TO~~
15 **AN INDIVIDUAL FOR THE CORRECTION OR RELIEF OF A CONDITION FOR WHICH**
16 **HEARING AIDS OR OSSEO-INTEGRATED DEVICES ARE WORN.**

18 (a) This title applies to an individual who practices audiology, hearing aid
19 dispensing, speech-language pathology, or music therapy, or assists in the practice of
20 speech-language pathology or audiology in the State.

21 (b) This title does not:

22 (1) Limit the right of an individual to practice a health occupation that the
23 individual is authorized to practice under this article;

24 (2) Prohibit an individual from practicing any other profession that the
25 individual is authorized to practice under the laws of this State; [or]

26 (3) Limit the right of a physician who is authorized to practice medicine
27 under the laws of the State to treat the human ear or fit hearing aids; OR

28 (4) APPLY TO THE SERVICING, MARKETING, SALE, DISPENSING, USE,
29 CUSTOMER SUPPORT, OR DISTRIBUTION OF OVER-THE-COUNTER HEARING AIDS
30 THROUGH IN-PERSON TRANSACTIONS, BY MAIL, OR ONLINE AS AUTHORIZED BY
31 FEDERAL LAW AND REGULATIONS.

2 (a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this title, an individual shall be
3 licensed by the Board before the individual may practice audiology, hearing aid dispensing,
4 speech-language pathology, or music therapy, or assist in the practice of speech-language
5 pathology or audiology in this State.

6 SECTION ~~2~~ 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
7 ~~October~~ July 1, 2023.
