comprehensive behavioral health workforce needs assessment on or before a certain

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1 <u>Technical Education Committee</u>, and other interested stakeholders, shall conduct a 2 comprehensive behavioral health workforce needs assessment.

4 (1) determine the immediate, intermediate, and long-term unmet need 5 and capacity of the behavioral health workforce in the State, including demographics and 6 gaps in specific professionals and paraprofessionals, accounting for retirements and other 7 turnover;

8 (2) calculate the total number of additional behavioral health professionals 9 and paraprofessionals needed over the next 5 years, 10 years, and 20 years;

10 (3) make findings and recommendations regarding the types of training, 11 education, and tuition assistance programs necessary to certify, recruit, place, supervise, 12 and retain the additional behavioral health professionals and paraprofessionals identified 13 in item (2) of this subsection; and

14 (4) recommend an initial allocation to the Behavioral Health Workforce 15 Investment Fund established under § 10–1602 of the Health – General Article, as enacted 16 by Section 1 of this Act, and identify specifically which programs the allocation will support 17 and the number of professionals and paraprofessionals the allocation will train, certify, 18 recruit, and place.

19 (c) On or before December 15, 2023 <u>October 15, 2024</u>, the Maryland Health Care 20 Commission shall submit the assessment to the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee, 21 the Senate Finance Committee, the House Appropriations Committee, and the House 22 Health and Government Operations Committee, in accordance with § 2–1257 of the State 23 Government Article.

24 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 25 1, 2023.
