FOR the purpose of changing the title of the Chief Executive Officer of the Prince George's County public school system to the County Superintendent of the Prince George's County public school system; altering the composition of, the qualifications for, and the method for selecting the search committee for the Chief Executive Officer County Superintendent of the Prince George's County public school system; and generally relating to the search committee for alterations to the title of the Chief Executive Officer of the Prince George's County public school system and search committee requirements.
BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
