- $\mathbf{5}$ FOR the purpose of altering the alcoholic beverages that may be sold under a certain 6 stadium license in Prince George's County; authorizing the holder of a Class 7 B-Stadium (baseball stadium) beer, wine, and liquor license to sell beer, wine, and 8 liquor for on-premises consumption; altering a provision of law providing that the 9 profit from the sale of certain alcoholic beverages under the license may accrue to 10 the use of the Maryland–National Capital Park and Planning Commission or the 11 concessionaire; altering the names of certain stadium licenses in the county; and 12generally relating to alcoholic beverages licenses in Prince George's County.
