BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article – State Government Section 9-1A-31(a)Annotated Code of Maryland (2021 Replacement Volume and 2022 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article - State Government 9-1A-31. Except as provided in paragraph (8) of this subsection, the local impact (a) (1)grants provided under § 9–1A–27 of this subtitle shall be distributed as provided in this subsection. (2)The following amounts shall be distributed to the following jurisdictions:

(8) Beginning after a video lottery operation license is issued to a video lottery facility in Baltimore City, 100% of the local impact grants provided under § 9–1A–27 of this subtitle from the proceeds of the video lottery facilities located in Allegany, Cecil, and Worcester counties shall be distributed to the local jurisdictions in which those video lottery facilities are located.
SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect July 1, 2023.
